Bainer Says Our Farms Are Wearing Out

"One Crop" System Particularly Hard on Farm Lands, Declares This Farming Authority.

"Statistics show that in many sections the yields per acre of our leading crops are gradually decreasing, especially where too much of the 'one cropping' systems are practiced," says H. M. Bainer, director of The Southwestern Wheat Improvement Association. "In some districts," he says, "the corn yield per acre has decreased as much as 40 per cent, wheat from 10 to 20 per cent and oats as much as 30 per cent."

"Yes, many of our farms are getting less and less productive, not because the nitrogen, phosphorus and potash are exhausted, but because of poor farming practices. Analysis of virgin and cultivated soils in several of the southwestern states shows that in many sections the organic matter and nitrogen have decreased as much as one per cent every year since the land was broken, this total loss often amounting to one-half of what the soil originally contained. A soil depleted of organic matter is dead; it runs together, bakes and holds very little water."

"It is safe to say that practically all of the so-called worn out farms of the southwest are run down, not because of the lack of plant food but because of a low supply of organic matter. This organic matter is not a thing that has to be purchased; it is produced right on the land, and when restored to the soil will bring back much of the original fertility. The solution must come through diversified farming, rotation of crops, more legumes and more livestock. A reasonable reduction in the acreage of corn and small grain crops and growing them in combination with alfalfa, clover, sweet clover, cow peas, soy beans and feed crops, and occasionally plowing under such crops while still green, will return this lost fertility, increase the yield, improve the quality and insure greater profits. None of the crop residues (straw, stubble and stalks) should be burned—increase the organic matter by plowing them under."

CANNING BEEF

The recipes listed below are for canning beef in glass jars. All jars used for canning meat should be thoroughly sterilized and should be warm when hot meat is placed in the jars. After jars are filled with meat and necessary amount of liquid, the rubbers and caps should be put into position but not screwed or fastened down tight until after processing is over.

Roast Beef

Select the piece of meat wanted for roast, trim, and wipe with a damp cloth. Heat some grease in a roasting pan, put in the meat and sear quickly, turning the meat so all sides are seared (this prevents the loss of meat juice during cooking). As soon as well seared sprinkle with salt and pepper to taste. Add some boiling water to the grease in the roasting pan. Baste frequently. Turn the meat from time to time and roast so it is nicely browned. Cook until meat is done (it should not be red in the center) without cooking it entirely tender. Slice and pack in jars to within 1-2 inch from top of jar. Add the gravy from the roasting pan with boiling water added so it barely covers the meat. (Leave at least 1-4 inch space between gravy and top of can) The above general recipe may be changed to suit the individual taste and the roast may be larded or trimmed with sprigs of parsley, cloves, etc., according to desire.

For a beef roast weighing 8 to 10 pounds use 2 to 3 tablespoons of grease, 1 to 2 tablespoons of salt (according to taste) 1-2 to 1 teaspoon of pepper (to taste) and 1-2 to 1 cup of oiling water. Baste frequently.

In the Steam Pressure Cooker process quart jars 55 to 60 minutes at 250 degrees F. or 15 pounds of steam pressure.

If one does not possess a Steam Pressure Cooker take the ordinary wash boiler with false bottom of slatted wood. Set the jars in the boiler with the hot water at least one inch

above the jars. When the water begins to boil, count from that period three hours. When through boiling, or processing as it is called, remove jars from boiler and tighten covers or lids and be careful that they are not allowed to stand in a draft.

Beef Steak

The sirloin of beef is skinned and cut into suitable pieces for steak. Some butter or grease is heated in a frying pan. The sliced steak is put in the hot grease and quickly seared on both sides. It is then sprinkled with salt and pepper to suit taste and nicely browned, then packed in the cans. (If desired, sliced onions, nicely browned, or small boiled and browned Irish potatoes may be packed in with the meat.) The cans are then filled to within 1-2 inch from top with hot gravy made from the pan grease with water added.

In the Steam Pressure Cooker process quart jars 55 to 60 minutes at 250 degrees F. or 15 pounds of steam pressure.

In wash boiler, process for three hours.

5,012 REGISTER FOR LONG TERM AT UNIVERSITY

Austin, Texas, Jan. 7.—Registration figures in the University of Texas broke all former records when the office of W. R. Long, auditor, closed Friday of last week with 5,012 students signed up for the long term.

The total reached is the largest ever recorded in the history of the state institution. There are 480 more students enrolled than at the same time last year and the precedent set shows an increase of ten and five-tenths per cent. The enrollment reached high mark this year in spite of the fact that at the end of the fall term just past the number of withdrawals were greater than ever before.

To Dorothy L. Bailey of Temple, goes the distinction of being the five thousandth student to register in the University. Miss Bailey is a sophomore in the College of Arts and Sciences.
