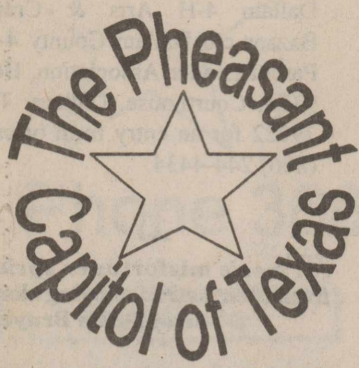

Breast cancer affects one in eight women. The key to winning the battle against cancer is early detection by having an annual breast exam, mammogram and performing a breast self-exam exam month.

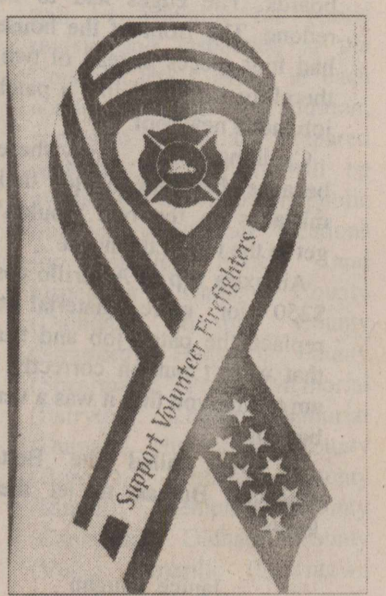
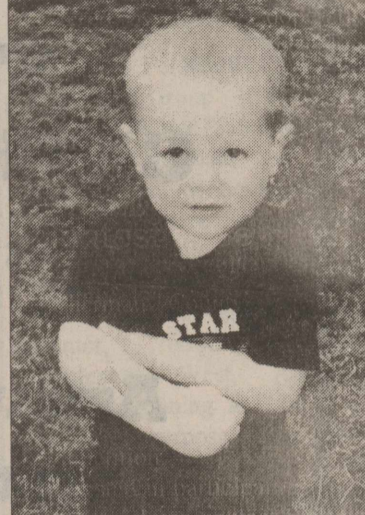

Whoa! The SISD Web page needs to add 1946-47 Band and their instructor Arden Dawson, of Texhoma, OK as the Band Instructor.

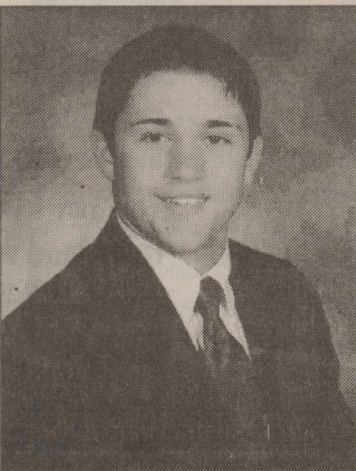

Parents Complete Fred Program

During the months of April and May, five parents enrolled in the Fathers Reading Every Day (FRED) program co-sponsored by Lollipop Junction and the Sherman County Office of Texas Cooperative Extension. Forty percent of those participants completed the program.

Participants who completed the program reported Redding to their child 113 books and spent over 10 hours reading during the four week reporting period. In addition, the parents reported reading to their child increased three times more per week and an increased satisfaction level as a parent. Parents reported that the FRED program led to improvement in their child's vocabulary and ability to count. They also stated that the program led to improved relationship with their child.

The FRED program emphasized the importance of

reading to children everyday, tips for reading to children, and the positive role of social and mental development of children. Each parent received a list of recommended age appropriate books for reading.

Caulking was everywhere, because they had to hide their mistakes so the rain wouldn't get to the top of the house.

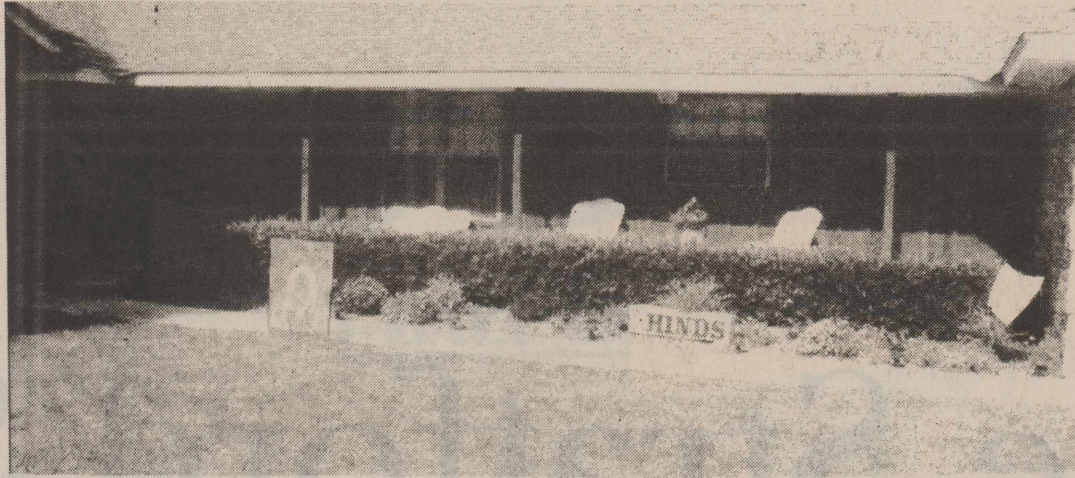
An extra trip to Amarillo cost \$250 for more material to replace the patch job and trim that wasn't put on correctly. I am telling you that it was a very bad job.

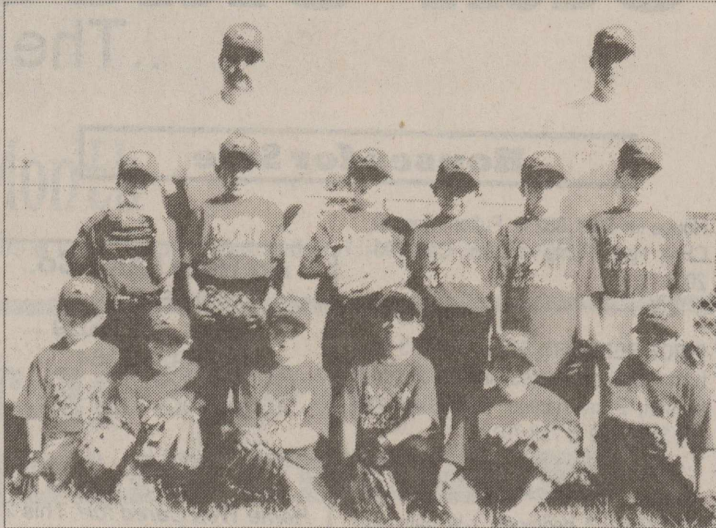
