Dryland wheat continues to decline from very dry conditions and heavy greenbug infestations. Virtually all areas of the Texas Panhandle have damaging infestations in isolated fields. More fields will likely become infested over the next 30 days. Under certain conditions some of the greenbugs will develop wings and fly to other fields rapidly spreading the infestation. Continue to monitor wheat for newly developing greenbug infestations.

The warmer temperatures have resulted in greater activity from lady beetles and parasitic wasps. Their numbers are up dramatically this week. If temperatures continue to warm, their level of activity and numbers should rapidly increase and help control the greenbug infestation.
