Curtis H. Kendrick

Curtis H. Kendrick, 88, died Wednesday, May 31, 2000.

Graveside services were held at 10 a.m. Saturday in Stratford Cemetery with the Rev. Jerry Stewart, pastor of First Baptist Church, officiating. Arrangements were by Morrison Funeral Directors.

Mr. Kendrick was born July 15, 1911 in Moody, Texas. He was drafted to the Army Air Corps in 1941 and served during World War II in Australia and New Guinea. He was awarded several decorations and retired as master sergeant in 1945.

Mr. Kendrick had lived in Stratford from 1946-51 and returned in 1966. He was a retired farmer and a member of the First Baptist Church. He married Donna Fogo in August 24, 1946 at Burr Oak, Kansas.

Survivors include his wife; three sons, David Kendrick of Redlands, Calif., Steven Kendrick of Austin and Rodney Kendrick of Bellevue, Washington; a daughter, Dana Maddox of Dallas, three brothers, Don Kendrick of Santa Rosa, Calif., Larry Kendrick of Monrovia, Calif., and Ralph Kendrick of Fountain Valley, Calif.; two sister, Janice Kenney of Woodinville, Wash., and Marcella Creagh of China, Texas; eight grandchildren and one great great grandson.

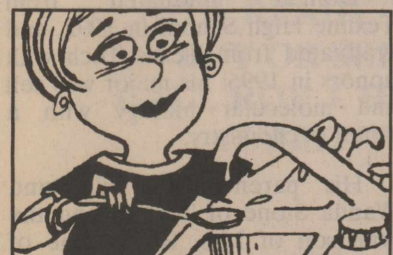
6. Take care of your car, no ripping-out or race dragging. Keep the car clean and serviced regularly. No alcohol or persons intoxicated in the car at any time. Be proud of your car.

7. Go to church regularly and take pride in your Church and home.

8. My parents are the judge of these rules and I will take the punishment they decide without prejudice. Before punishment or judgment is passed on disobeying these rules we will all have a table Court and talk the situation over. No one parent may judge alone. All penalties handed down from these courts are subject to be lightened or suspended for real good behavior.

9. All rules in these rules may be amended at any court at any time with the parents acting as judges.

PUBLIC COMMENT/PUBLIC MEETING You may submit public comments, a request for a public meeting about this application, or a request for a contested case hearing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TNRCC will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. The deadline to submit public comments is 30 days after newspaper notice is published. After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will prepare a response to all relevant and material or a significant public comments.

The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or ask questions about the application. A public meeting about the application will be held if the executive director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

If only comments are received on the application, the response to comments, along with notice of the executive director's action on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted

comments or is on the mailing list for this application.

If a hearing request is timely, the executive director will issue a preliminary decision on the application following technical review. Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the final deadline for submitting public comments.

After the final deadline for public comments following any required Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. The response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who is on a mailing list for this application.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING You may request a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a

contested case hearing is filed within 30 days from this notice, the executive director may approve the application if no hearing request is received within this 30-day period, no further opportunity for hearing will be provided. A contested case hearing will only be granted based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on those issues raised during the public comment period and not withdrawn.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. If requesting a (contested case) hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number, and fax number, if any; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "I/we request a (contested case) hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; and (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility. If the request is made by a group or an association, the one or more members who have standing to request a hearing and the interests the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing within 30 days following this notice to the

Office of the Chief Clerk, at the address below.

If a hearing request is timely filed, additional notice will be provided. Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the executive director will forward the application and any requests for contested case hearing to the TNRCC Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact relating to relevant and material air quality concerns raised during the comment period. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the Commissions jurisdiction to address in this proceeding.
