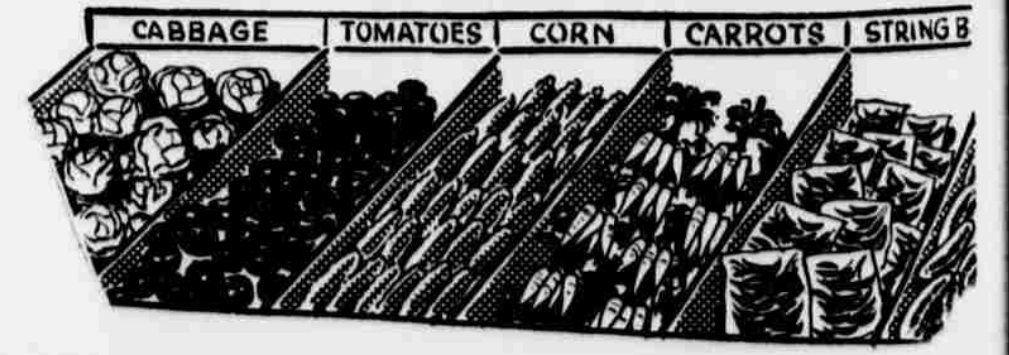

Judge Dennis Ratliff Recalls First Visit Here 40 Years Ago

Although 40 years have passed, the date of May 10, 1921, is recalled as if it were only a few weeks ago by Judge Dennis P. Ratliff, one of West Texas' best known lawyers.

On that date in 1921, a young attorney from Wise County got off the passenger train about dusk and had his first view of Haskell. Judge Ratliff recalls that he rode a hotel transfer back, as a taxi or bus was called in those days, from the depot to the Norton Hotel, where he spent his first night in Haskell.

His father, the late Judge L. D. Ratliff, had decided to move his family from Decatur to Haskell some weeks earlier, and had entered a law partnership here with the late Judge H. G. McConnell.

Dennis recalls that Haskell had no paved streets at the

time, and during rainy weather streets around the square were almost impassable. Not only were Haskell streets muddy, but there was not a foot of paved road or highway in the entire county, he remembered.

His most vivid recollection concerns the first few months he was here. Judge McConnell, a pioneer lawyer here, who was on the verge of retiring, was in California for the summer, and Judge L. D. Ratliff was still spending considerable time in Decatur. That left young Dennis in charge of the law office here.

He remembers that prospective clients (or he took them to be) would come in the office and inquire for Judge McConnell. Dennis would explain Judge McConnell was in California, wouldn't be back for several months. Then he would politely inquire if he could be of help. Invariably the answer was a discouraging, "No, Sonny. I'll just wait until the Judge gets back."

However, the young lawyer's abilities were soon recognized and he became and still is one of the area's leading attorneys. In addition, he has been honored with numerous positions of trust, including the offices of State Legislator and District Judge.

He has been an active member and an elder in the Christian Church for many years, has been a leading worker in civic affairs, clubs and fraternal organizations and has served as commander of the Rogers-Cox Post of the American Legion.

Month of April Is Driest On Record Here

For the first time in the 71-year history of local weather records, no measurable rainfall was received in Haskell during the month of April, local weather observer Sam Herren reported Monday.

Traces of moisture were recorded on April 8, 9, 12 and 26, but not sufficient to be measured, he reported. Normal rainfall for April is 2.69 inches.

Total rainfall in 1961 to date is 4.46 inches, considerably under the normal of 5.65 inches for the first four months of the year.

April temperatures ranged from a low of 36 degrees on three days, April 1, 9 and 16, to a high of 98 degrees on April 24.

Many Area Landowners Interested In Soil and Water Conservation

The building of terrace systems so late in the season when land preparation for planting is at hand, is ample evidence of the growing concern that landowners and operators have to save soil and water on their cropland, declares Harry Koehler, Conservation Aid with the local SCS unit.

The following Wichita Brazos Soil Conservation District cooperators have completed building terrace systems: R. L. Liles and Vern Derr of Weinert; C. W. Atchison of the Mattson community; C. G. Euron Jr. of Haskell. Also, J. P. Perrin of Haskell plans to rebuild an old terrace system that was checked out by technicians of the Soil Conservation Service for proper specifications.

California Creek Soil Conservation District cooperators

Have also completed a number of terrace systems. They include G. A. Roberts west of Haskell, Jack Chapman of the Mattson community, and Joe Clark of Sagerton.

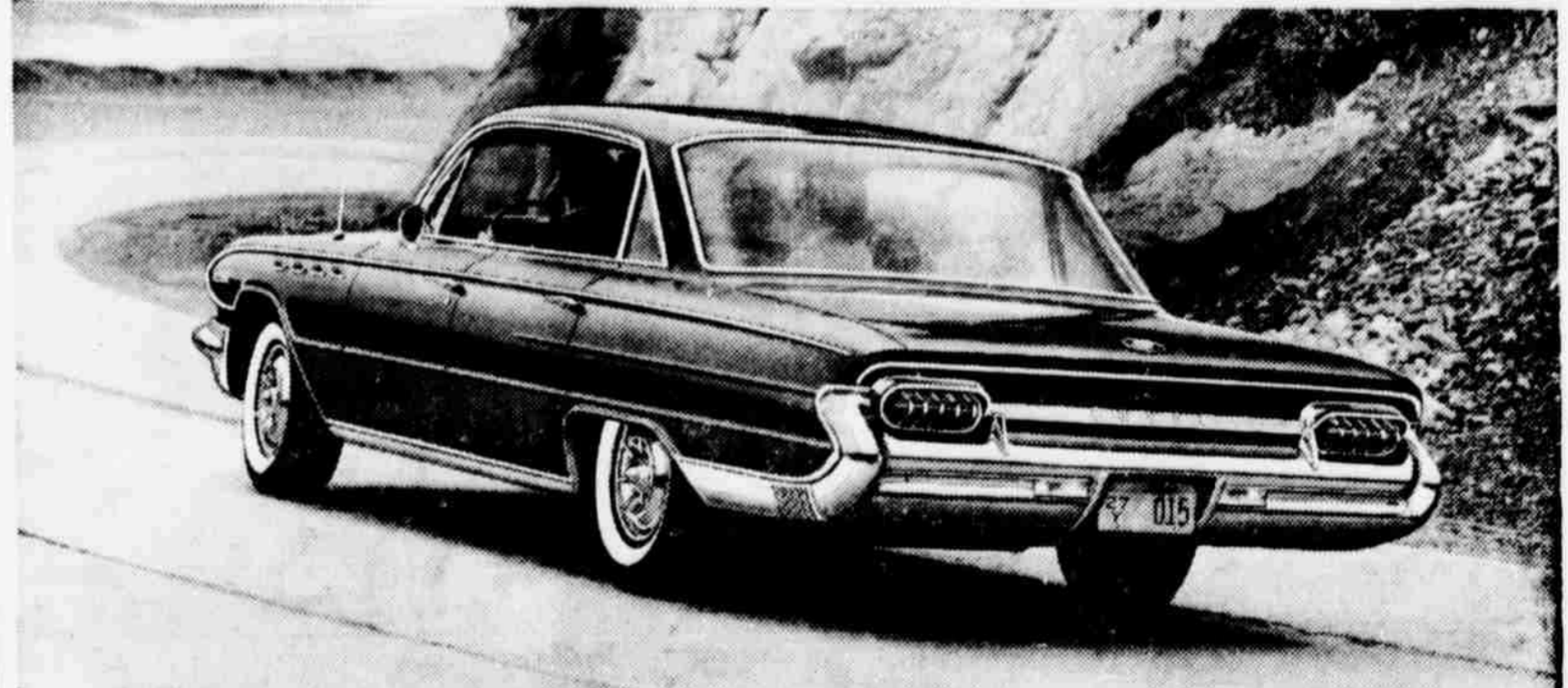
Jack Chapman, cooperating with the California Creek SCD and who lives near Mattson, has completed shaping up a waterway on his farm. Shaped areas to increase water carrying capacity, protected by a grass cover, permits safe disposal of run-off water.

Thomas J. Bevel, cooperating with the Wichita Brazos SCD, has started shaping a waterway to handle an outside water problem. Excess run-off

water flowing across cropland will now be concentrated in the shaped area. This will permit more desirable run-off of outside water.

Considerable interest has been shown in contour farming in the past few months. The additional water holding capacity of rows run on the land is desirable practice on gentle sloping land.

Cropland diverted to the feed grain program can be planted to a summer legume or cover crop. If you plan to participate in the feed grain program, why not plant those diverted acres to a summer legume. Koehler suggests.

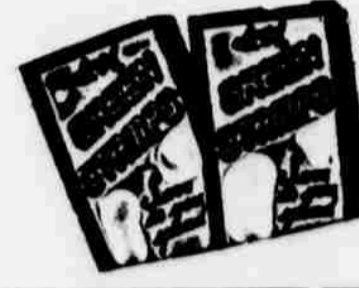
