The most important skill your child will ever learn is to read. We at MAE, are committed to just that. Your child is exposed and taught various reading strategies from kindergarten through 4th grade. \*When your child reads to you, ask him or her questions about the selection. Who, what, where, when and how are good questions to ask.

\*Make sure your child knows your value reading and it is important in your life. Let your children see you reading.
