



Do you enjoy reading the daily paper? Most people do. Why? They want to get the news. And what is reported? The reporters go out to see and hear what is taking place in the world. If there has been a tornado or hurricane, they report what they have seen and heard. Then there are also editorials on the news. He rose again to prove that sacrifice was acceptable to God the Father. All of this was seen and hear. The Bible reports what was seen and heard as good news. That's what the gospel is, good news.






