


4Given Enters National Singing Competition

Payments will be based producers can expect to receive on 45 percent of the established price for crops that could have been insured or covered by NAP, but were not. "CDP payments will be limited to \$80,000 per producer and/or entity, but funding for the program is unlimited," said Hemphill. "Although no sign-up deadline has been announced, we are striving

Walk Across Texas Health Break

Most people know they should increase their activity level by walking or aerobics classes. In fact, many of you probably made a New Year's resolution this year to start on January 1 and have already given up. Is there hope?

The answer is yes. Changing any habit requires several tries and a great deal of effort for most people. Increasing your activity level can have a great impact on your health both now and later in life.

A recent article in the Archives of Internal Medicine reported on a study where 100 middle-aged women were encouraged to walk for exercise while another 100 were not encouraged to walk. Ten years later, women in the walking group had significantly less health problems than the non-walking group of women. The women in the walking group were walking seven miles more each week than those in the other group. Only 2% of the walking group were diagnosed with heart disease, whereas almost 13% of the nondisease. Walkers also had fewer hospitalizations, surgeries and falls. So, trying again is important. Studies have shown that walking with others and engaging in a program long enough to make walking a habit promote success. Walk Across Texas is a free, fun, group physical activity program. Getting started is the hard part, but starting and keeping going is much easier with the support of others!


COMMENT/NOTICE AND **COMMENT HEARING.** You may submit written public comments or request a notice and comment hearing on the draft permit. Comments relating to the accuracy, completeness and appropriateness of the permit actions may cause a change to be made to the draft permits.

A person who may be affected by the emission of all' pollutants from these areas may request a notice and comment hearing. The TCEQ may grant a notice and comment hearing on these applications if a written hearing request is filed within 30 days after publication of the newspaper notice. The purpose of a notice and comment hearing is to provide an opportunity to submit comments on

the draft permits. If a notice and comment hearing is granted, all individuals that submitted written comments or a hearing request will receive written notice of the hearing. This notice will identify the date, time and location for the hearing.

A notice of proposed final action that includes a response to comments and identification of any changes to the draft permits, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments, a hearing request, or requested to be on the mailing list for this application. This mailing will also provide instructions for public petitions to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to request that EPA object to the issuance of the proposed permits. After receiving a petition, the EP A may only object to the issuance of a permit which is not in compliance with its applicable requirements or the requirements of 30 T AC Chapter 122.






