## AgriPartner Report

## Dallam, Sherman, Hartley and Moore Counties

Southwestern and European corn borer moths increased in numbers over the past two weeks. Check plants for eggs an
small larvae, for second generation corn borer often reac infestation levels that justifies an insecticide application.
