

Patronage Distribution **Benefits** Stockholder Borrowers

Great Plains Ag Credit, ACA has recently distributed \$612,000 in eash patronage to its stockholders according to Carroll Haygood, the lending agriculture cooperatives president. He noted that both the amount of earnings being allocated to stockholders and the cash distributions paid out through GPAC's Patronage Allocation Program has increased in recent years. It was reported that \$4.1 million in earning has been allocated through the program since the 2000 year. The patronage program defrays interest costs o both short and long term borrowers, according to the release. GPAC serves numerous agriculture producers and agribusinesses in the western two-thirds of the Panhandle and upper South Plains, and is headquartered in Amarillo. Loan offices are also in Plainview, Dalhart, Dumas, Friona, Tulia, Olton, Muleshoe and Dimmitt. The ag lender was formerly known as Plainview and Amarillo PCA's. The associations merged in 1999 and in 2001, federal land bank association operations began in order to better serve producers.

Press dough evenly into bottom of lightly greased 13x9x2inch pan. Arrange apple slices over dough. In small bowl, mix together full pouch cinnamon topping mix and nuts. Sprinkle over apples. Bake 40-45 minutes. Serve warm with vanilla ice cream, if desired.
