similar tasks of service. Do you get the point? Good feclings are not required before our work. setuality, they come after our good deeds. So don't be fooled. If you are blue because of the
work before yon work before you, get busy. Joy is found in doing your work not in avoiding it. Avoiding work will
only lead you into depression. "II you know these things, you are happy if you do them."
