## HOMEOWNERS

Texans aged 65 or older ca current taxes on their homes. They can take advantage of a tax option called "over-65 deferral" by signing an affidavit at the
Sherman County Appraisal Sherman Coun
ice.
District office.
If the affidavit is on file, older homeowner cannot lose a homestead because of delinquent taxes. Once a homeowner files an over-65 tax deferral affidavit with the appraisal district, no taxing unit can start or continue a
lawsuit for delinquent taxes as long as that person owns and lives in that home. The tax deferral only postpones paying delinquent taxes on the home; it does not cancel them.

## News from Stratford Hospital District

 Stratford Emergency Medical Services just received its New ambularce on April 13. Our oldambulance was 12 years old and had 140 theusand miles on it. The reco ambulance was 12 years old and had 140 thousand miles on it. The recommended replacement
time for an ambulance is 5 to 10 years, depending on usage. Our to 180 miles per trip. This necessitates the replacement on a regular basis. The EMS maintains two ambulances at all times. The last replacement was in 2000 after 10 years of service on that ambulance. The Stratford Hospital District maintains a fund specifically for replacing ambulances as they are aged out. The Hospital District was able to assist the Stratford Volunteer Fire Department by passing the ambulance on to them. Shorter runs in these situations make this feasible for the fire department. It will be used to store and transport the Jaws of life and has worked well in the past and allows our fellow volunteers to benefit the county on continuing basis. WE are all proud of our new ambulance. You will be able to see the ambulance on display Sunday afternoon at Coldwater Manor. A "rendition" is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the taxable $p$
this year.

Who must file a rendition?
You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income-such as the deentory and equipment used by a business. If you ren tion, a $10 \%$ to $50 \%$ penalty may be imposed.

Are there any advantages to you?
The advantages of filing a rendition are

- You give your opinion of your propert's's.alue. The hange and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.
- Yourecord your correct mailing address soy your tax bills sill go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong
address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your axes on time or paying extra charges for late payments.
- You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify value of your property in 2006 . The district will look at your property before assigning a value in 2007.
