Guerra To Participate In Democracy Leadership Program

Yamili Guerra, SHS senior, has been selected to participate in the Experience in Democracy Leadership Program in Washington D.C. July 22-July 26. The trip is sponsored by the Migrant Education division of Region 16 Educational Service Center in Amarillo.

Guerra is one of three panhandle students who was chosen for the program that lists its goals as strengthening civic participation at the national and local level, strengthening academic skills, promoting literacy and developing leadership within the migrant and immigrant community.

Meeting with other Texas delegates in Washington, D.C., Guerra will present issues and develop an agenda to present to members of Congress. The group will learn about the three branches of government and the legislative process involved in making a bill into law.

Wendy Branstein, Region 16 Migrant Education Coordinator, who will accompany the three panhandle delegates, says the trip will be "a life-changing experience for Guerra". "We have seen how the students grow to become leaders in their schools and communities through the skills and knowledge they receive on the Washington trip," Branstein said. Other educational experiences will include a tour of the Library of Congress, the White House, the

Holocaust Museum, the Native American Museum, the Air and Space Museum, the House and Senate Chambers and the JFK Center.

1921-2007

Lorraine R. Mehner-86 passed away Monday, May 21, 2007 in Stratford, Texas.

Celebration of Life services were held at 2:00 p.m. Thursday, May 24, 2007 at the First United Methodist Church with Rev. Gene Weintette, pastor officiating, assisted by Rev. John Wagoner, retired Methodist minister of Amarillo. Burial was at Stratford Cemetery under the direction of Morrison Funeral Directors of Stratford.

Lorraine R. Mehner was born May 8, 1921 in Stratford, Texas. She was a lifelong resident of Stratford. At the age of four she began her music career when she sang over the radio in Ft. Worth while visiting relatives. She later graduated from Texas Tech University in Lubbock with a degree in Music Education. Lorraine taught music to elementary school children for 30 years and gave private music lessons for 15 years after retirement. One of her greatest joys in life was teaching children to love and appreciate music. Lorraine gave her musical talents of singing, playing the piano, organ and guitar not only to her students but also to her church. She played the piano at the First United Methodist Church for 45 years. She also was the pianist for Eastern Star, Prospectus Study Club and countless other musical events and organizations. Lorraine played for weddings, funerals and civic events.

In 1982 she was nominated for the Texas Panhandle Award to Women for Distinguished Service in the field of education At West

Texas State University. She was named Citizen of the Year in Stratford in 1983. Lorraine loved Stratford and supported her hometown businesses by shopping at home most all of the time and supporting all other activities when she could. Lorraine was truly an inspiration to many and was greatly loved by her family and friends. Her boundless energy and dedication to everything she did was only surpassed by her wonderful smile and the love she showed others. "Many women do noble things, but you surpassed them all." Letters to the Editor

Dear Editor;

During the past few weeks I've heard many comments, remarks and complaints about the proposed ethanol plant. No one in this community has been asked to spend any money on this project but for some reason it's being "cussed and discussed". This company will be bringing tax revenue into this county along with good paying jobs, which are few and far between right now. This company also chooses to abide by the state and federal rules and regulations, which means they can not start moving dirt or begin to build this facility before the state approves their permits. The air permit cost \$75,000 and takes approximately 6-9 months for the state to award. The Panda Ethanol Company still has options on the land, but the sale will be finalized when the state approves the permits. Not everyone's land can be chosen for the plant site but with ethanol-related business looking at this area, there still might be a chance for other landowners to sell as well. This permitting process is nearly complete and the state should be making their decision in the next few weeks. UNTIL ALL PERMITS ARE APPROVED NOTHING WILL BE HAPPENING ON THE SITE. This is a very long and arduous process, but it will be a big economic asset to Sherman County.

These are just a few facts that maybe some of you don't know about ethanol or this proposed project:

1 The U.S. imports about 60% of the crude oil processed in U.S. refineries. Ethanol will reduce

dependency on foreign oil. Do you want the Middle East to continue to control our lives?

2 Ethanol is replacing MTBE as a fuel additive to reduce harmful emissions; MTBE is now banned in 20 states due to harmful effects if it reaches water supplies.

3 Major automobile manufacturers have developed Flexible Fuel Vehicles (FFV) that can run on gas or E85 fuel. These companies are not going to spend the money or the time on research like this unless they know what's coming down the road.

4 If you have purchased a FFV but can not find a fuel station carrying ethanol, it's not the car manufacturer's fault, it's not the ethanol company's fault, it's the oil companies. One company in the Austin area has started making E85 available to their customers. HEB, the largest supermarket chain in central and south Texas, has fuel islands onsite at their grocery stores. In the past few months they have added ethanol and biodiesel pumps through a partnership with a small distributor.

5 The proposed plant for Sherman County will create approximately 60-63 fulltime jobs and generate nearly \$3 million in payroll annually. If you are not in agriculture, your kids will probably leave here after graduation and never look back because there is nothing for them to come home to. With this type of industry these young people could make a good living in their hometown.

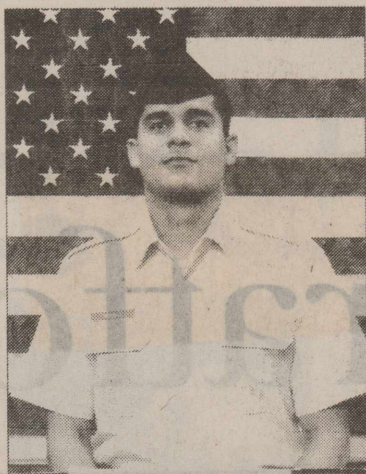
6 This plant has the probability of expanding the area economic base by \$200 million per year. Since the announcement last fall, I have visited with 78 companies

that are industry-related that would like to build close to this plant.

7 Sherman County has got to find a way to survive and one way to do that is to diversify. This plant will have an overall positive impact without putting undue stress on the local infrastructure.

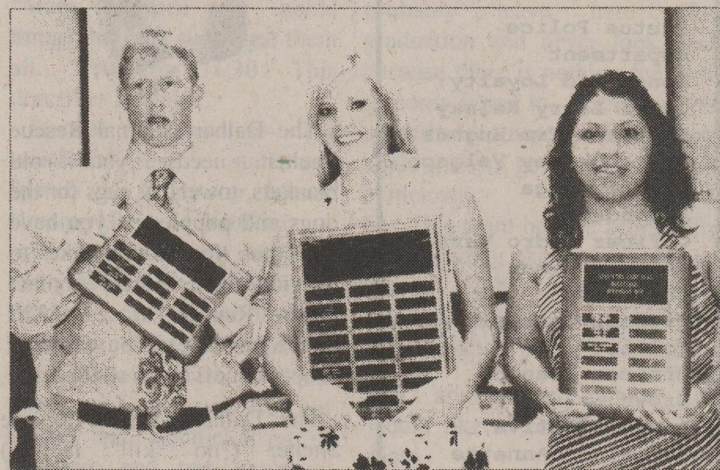
