## Stratford Invited to Join Housing Development Program

By Bailey Naugle pilot program, created by the Panhandle Reportunt to take part in a pilot program, created by the Panhandle Regional Planning
Commission, which will begin to address the housing deficiency the Texas Panhandle.
At a preliminary meeting last week Gary Pitner, executive director of the PRPC, explained that the lack of housing in our area is a growing concern. "Housing is becoming a bigger and bigger issue," he said.
The problem exists throughout the Panhandle, but the PRPC ha decided to start small by developing the program within a few select communities. "We want to test the wat
Dumas, Dalhart and Stratford have been invited to join the initiative, which entails a three year commitment and a $\$ 300,000$ budget. The Amarillo Area Foundation and the PRPC have both already pledged $\$ 100,000$. Each community that enrolls in the program must contribute an equal portion of the remaining $\$ 100,000$ which would mean an $\$ 11,000$ contribution per year for three years. According to Pitner, Dalhart has officially committed to the effort
and Dumas is expected to participate. The Sherman County Development Committee has conveyed support for the proposal, and the issue is on the agenda for the Stratford City Council meeting on October 30th. The PRPC has asked for a commitment by the end of October. If Stratford chooses not to participate, another community will be approached. Doug Nelson, economic development director for the PRPC said, "We are going to places to gauge interest. If there s no interest we will step on.
Pitner explained that the Amarillo Area Foundation has made a
generous contribution and timing is important "We need to enerous contribution and timing is important. "We
Dumas, Dalhart and Stratford are preferable to the commissio because the cities have some common issues and represent a range of populations.
"That is great for learning," said Pitner. The cities are also within a
close proximity which will allow for efficient use of time and close proximity which will allow for efficient use of time and resources. "We don't want to spend all our time driving," he said.
Once three communities have committed to the initiative, epresentatives from the group will hire an individual to work within the three communities full-time, managing the operation. The commission hopes to move quickly, "We would love to hire someone shortly after the first of the year," said Pitner.
Kathy Allen, director of the SCDC, receives heaps of mail
employee who can concentrate on the issue full-time. "If you have anything else to focus on, you can't do it. Housing is huge right now," she said.
Nelson said that the position requires a person with a background in finance and real estate. It should be someone that is able to work with landowners, developers and potential homebuyers. "They must be said. community. "One problem with federal programs is that they are a quare peg and you have a round hole," said Pitner. "The person hired will mold it into a round object to fit into your community.
The $\frac{\rightarrow T}{3} 000,000$ budget will cover expenses and the salary of the person hired for three years, which Nelson ensured would be ample right person. At three years we should have tangible results to show," he said.
Potential housing solutions include new homes and apartmen omplexes and renovated structures.
How land and construction will be paid for depends on how each

## Ask the Geek

## Memory is Not What You Think

Let's take this week to explain a common misconception about computer hardware. It's another one of those things that technicians and even some advertisements about computers assume that the onsumer already knows, but it's not often that anyone bothers Complain the
computers store and retrieve data in different ways. When you
power your computer on, it begins to store information temporarily your computer's memory or "RAM (random access memory)." If you (or your computer) decide that something is worth preserving, that data is then written to your computer's hard drive. RAM is temporary. When your computer loses power, whether intentional or not, the current contents of your RAM are lost. Each leared out for fresh usage. On the other hand, infor
hard drive is significantly more permanent, which is good, becaus nobody wants to re-type their Christmas card list every year. Hard drives store the information until something needs it
Hard drives aren't nearly as fast as memory. It's just like a human. For example, if I asked you what your phone number was, you could
rattle it off to me easily because it is stored in your "memory" If $I$ asked you for the number of the nearest pizza delivery place (where that, by the way?), you could find the information in the phone book. However, the time it would take you to relay the correct information back to me would be longer because you have to look up the information, then store it in your "memory" before you tell it to me.
Hard drives and RAM work together constantly. When you power Hard drives and RAM work together constantly. When you power
on your computer, large chunks of your computer's operating system are read from the hard drive and stored (temporarily) into RAM. When you access programs, portions of those programs are copied into RAM while they're in use. When you open a document, that document is loaded into RAM while you're working on it, then the changes are written back to the hard drive when you click "Save." So, what happens when a program requests that something be
written into your RAM, but your memory is already full? Your computer won't (usually) just give up and lock down. Your computer's operating system is designed to "cheat"a a bit. It takes data that is hanging out in RAM and writes it to a special place on the hard
drive. Then it uses the place where that data was stored in RAM for drive. Then it uses the place where that data was stored in RAM for
the new data that has requested a stay. Unfortunately, this creates a bit the new data that has requested a stay. Unfortunately, this creates
of a bottleneck. Now, when the portion of the program that was of a bottleneck. Now, when the portion of the program that was mporarily written to the hard drive needs to be used, it must be to be written temporarily to the hard drive... you get the picture. This is what is called "swapping," or "paging." Your computer is swapping information from one form of memory to another. It's a slow process. Now you'll understand why computer guys are always telling you
that you need more memory. It's not that your computer cah't store that you need more memory. It's not that your computer cain't store
enough information, it's because you're wanting to run more programs enough information, it's because you're wanting to run more programs
at once than your RAM will allow for before getting full and having to "page" to your hard drive. You may have tons of free space on you hard drive, but if you don't have enough RAM, you'll quickly see your computer slow to a crawl just when you need it most.
