State agency probes methadone deaths

HOUSTON (AP) - Ten The deaths were confirmed by methadone-related deaths in a state health officials, who declinprompted an investigation have ed to give specifics about the Texas Department of Health. The city's drug-related deaths are more than the state had experienced in the 20-year history of the controve
ment program.
"This is the first grouping of deaths we're aware of,", Ken Davis, chief investigator for the food and drug division, said Tues day. "Historically, we've had only two or three cases of deaths (total) in Texas."
Officials say at least three people who died were patients of Dr. who operates two physician methadone clinics and whose federal permits for methadone
treatment have been recommended for suspension or revocation. Houston Chronicle and rare federal censures were detailed in U.S. Food \& Drug Administration documents released to the newspaper this week
through a Freedom of Informa. tion Act request.
The documents also revealed that the FDA also has recomof another Houston methadone program's license. That clinic, the Maintenance Clinic at 102 Portland, is not linked to any of
the deaths. Program sponsor the deaths. Program sponsor
Slater Martin could not be reached for comment, the Chronicl reported.

deaths and claimed the recommendations against him ar politically motivated by com-
