AUSTIN (AP) - Passage of a
bill to honor slain civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. with a full state holiday can only boost Texas in the eyes of the
country, the measure's sponsor said. "t'll send a message
throughout the nation throughout the nation that we in people in Texas, that we are
multicultural recognize that peaceful means of changing the system are in fact a
valid way to do it," said Rep. Ron Wilson, D-Houston.
The Texas House on Wednes day tentatively approved the bill to designate Martin Luther King Jr. Day a full state holiday, to be
celebrated the third Monday in
January,
Wilson's bill also would delete Columbus Day, the second Mon-
day in October, from the list of state holidays. Columbus Day has not been funded as an official holiday for several years by state
budget writers, Wilson said budget writers, Wilson said.
An amendment to the bill An amendment to the bill prowould be observed with "appropriate ceremonies throughout
the state" to honor Christopher the state" to honor Christopher
Columbus. But state workers would not be paid to take the day off. Rep. Robert Saunders, DLaGrange, who represents the ci-
