acute appendicitis, as an example the surgeon is often governed by the presence or absence of leukocy tosis, a normal leukocyte count usually indi-
cates that the infection is not severe, whereas an elevated count ordinarily
means an operation is needed. There are non-infectious causes of

example, leukemia (blood cell cancer) always increases the white blood cell
count. Thus, the white count must be viewed in the context of the patient's
