Thyroid cancer has good prognosis

husband has recently been diagnosed with papillary thyroid cancer. Can
you provide facts on cause, procedures and prognosis?
DEAR READER: Papillary carcinoma is the most common thyroid maiignancy, constituting about 65
percent of all thyroid cancers. The
cause is unknown, but it is frequently associated with a history of radiation
exposure (such as X-ray treatments
that were popular years ago for acne therapy). The tumor often affects
young poople (under 40 years) and is
more common young people (under 40 years) and is
more common in women. The cancer
appears to be less malignant in younappears to be less malignant in youn-
ger patients than in the elderly. Treatment consists of surgical re-
moval of the malignancy, followed by thyroid suppression, meaning syn-
thetic thyroid hormone is used to deactivate the thyroid gland, thereby
suppressing any natural production of
