 Market Report in DetailKansas Citv Stock Yards, Dec 15. 1915. - Cattle of all classes made gains last week. Order buvers say prices here are high markets east and they are in a masition to judge, a s their business depends on being able to fill orders to an advantage here When markets east are getting plenty of beef at a reasonable price, outside orders are scarce here. The supply today is 18000 cattle, containing a large propor tion of stockers and feeders. Beef cattle sold steady in most cases, although Chicago reports 20000 cattle and lower prices. Heavy steers brought $\$ 10$, and yearlings also brought that price. Other yearlings brought $\$ 9.40$ and other heavy steers brought $\$ 9.25$. Middle class
steers sell up to $\$ 8.50$ and pretty teers sell up to $\$ 8.50$ and pretty good short fed steers $\$ 7.25$ to $\$ 8$, warmed up steers $\$ 6.50$ to $\$ 7$. Butcher grades are selling strong, choice heavy bulls $\$ 6$, heifers $\$ 9$ In every clase there is spread between the best and the cheapest and it is the cifficulty that feeders have in appreciat ing this that causes disappointment in some of the sales. Stuckers and feeders advanc 25 to 50 cents last week, contaary to the usual December

Washington, D. C. -The "green bug", otherwise known as the spring grain aphis, has made its appearance in Tennessee, Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas and New Mexico. Farmers are urged by the United States De-
partment of Agriculture to watch their fields carefully for spots where the pest is abundant and the wheat plants change to a red or yellow color. Such spots or areas should be imme-
dately plowed under and rolled, diately plowed under and rolled,
