**CITY ORDINANCE**

An Ordinance authorizing the operation of pool halls, defining same, providing regulation thereof, location thereof requiring a tax to be paid for the operation thereof and providing a penalty for violation of these requirements.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Haskell, Texas:

ARTICLE I: That on and after the effective date hereof it shall be lawful to operate Pool Halls within the City Limits of the City of Haskell, Haskell County, Texas, under the rules and regulations prescribed herein.

ARTICLE II: The term "Pool Hall," as used herein, shall mean and include the following: Any room, hall or building in which is exhibited any pool or billiard table or tables for the purpose of permitting games placed thereon for hire, revenue, prize, fees or gain of any kind.

ARTICLE III: All pool halls shall open not earlier than 8 o'clock a. m. on weekdays and shall close by 12 o'clock midnight, and shall remain closed on Sundays.

ARTICLE IV: The operator of such pool hall shall not permit any drinking of intoxicants, gambling or betting upon any

game played in said hall, nor upon any event, game, election or other things which shall be undetermined at the time such attempted wager is made.

The fact that there is an agreement that the loser of a game agrees to pay the cost thereof is not considered gambling, but any agreement to pay a greater sum than the cost of the use of the table and equipment for the game shall be considered gambling.

ARTICLE V: No such pool hall shall be permitted to operate in the City of Haskell at a location which is greater than a distance of two blocks from the streets forming the city square.

ARTICLE VI: The operator of such a pool hall violating any of the provisions of Articles III, IV and V of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars and the City Council may, upon proof of violations of said three articles, or any of them, or any other provision of this ordinance, revoke the license or permit of

the operator of such pool hall.

ARTICLE VII: The City Secretary shall collect a tax of \$5.00 per table annually from the operator of each pool hall application for a permit shall be accompanied by the first year's tax and said application shall be in writing and upon such form as the City Council may require.

ARTICLE VIII: This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication.

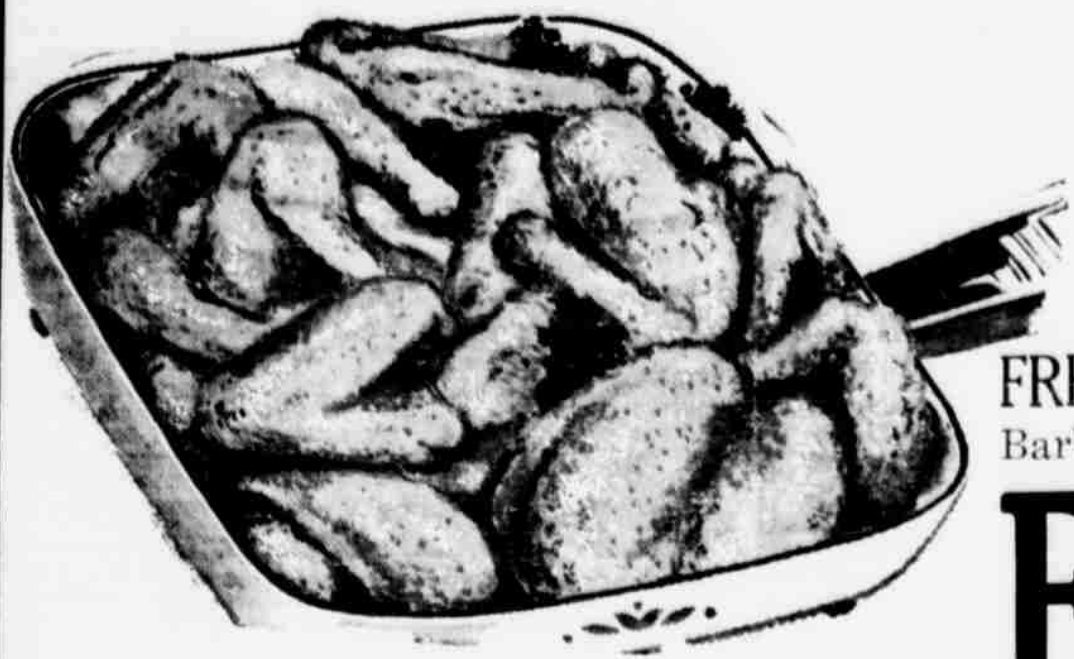
