### Floydada First and Only County Seat of Floyd County

Election Won by a Majority of 24 votes out of a total vote cast of 972

Undoubtedly the people who live in Floyd County outside of the two precincts of Floydada and Lockney, are certainly in favor of Floydada as the county seat in preference to a place on the bald prairie away from the railroad. This was evidenced by the eighth. Of the eight boxes besides Floydada and Lockney Floydada received a solid vote in four and a good majority in two. The four going solid for Flovdada were Lakeview, with 58. McCov or Starkey, with 45, Baker with 39, and Flomot with 18. Sandhill gave Floydada a majority of eight out of 58 votes and Center voted over double for Floydada, 21 to 9. The Center precinct includes the proposed county site.
