Please address large. When we speak of Floyd we include the adjoining counties, for they are like twin sisters. There are but very few running streams on the plains and we have to sink for water from 10 to 150 feet. Generally, around Della Plain we sink from 50 to 125 and obtain an abundance of pure cold water, well tasted. The soil is compacked and we never have to wall or case our wells. The climate, in summer is very nice, cool nights and pleasant days—a good breeze, generally. In the winter the weather is colder than in the valleys; snow falls from one to eight inches, remains from one to ten days. When the cold northers come, it makes it quite unpleasant for a day or two then the wind changes to the southwest and there are several days of pleasant weather. We were shown stock that went through last winter on the grass, and they looked well in March and April. Many build wind breaks of sod walls, by taking a large plow and breaking the sod, then cutting it in the desired length, (2 or 3 feet long) and building walls 40 to 100 feet long by 5 or 6 feet in height which makes a good wind break for stock. Many build houses of sod, or adobe (sun-dried brick) which makes good and confortable

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
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
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
