For Homes

agricultural engineer with the Texas Agricultural Extension
Service Service. to assist consumers in purchas-
ing an insulation product or enlisting a contractor's services. Available in a variety o
forms, home insulation can be forms, home insulation can be
purchased in blankets, in batts, purchased in blankets, in batts,
in a form which is bagged and ready to pour, and in a form
which must be blown in which must be blown in place by
a contractor using specially a contractor using specially
designed equipment.
Three basic types of products Three basic types of products are most commonly used,
according to Stewart, all having according to Stewart, all having
high insulating value if properly high insulating value if properly
manufactured and installed: --Mineral wool, which includ es rock wool and fibrous glass Both of these products can be poured or blown in place or
purchased in blankets or batts purchased in blankets or batts
with a foil or paper vapor barrier.
--Plastic foam/resin, which is --Plastic foam/resin, which is
made of polystyrene, polyuretmade of polystyrene, polyuret-
hane or urea formaldehyde can be purchased in pre-formed
sheets or foamed in place by a sheets or foamed in place by a contractor. Foam insulation can vary considerably in its final
properties depending on the properties depending on the
operator's skill, how various operator's skill, how various
reactants are mixed, and the
time allowed for "curing," time allowed for "curing."
--Cellulosic insulation, made -Cellulosic insulation, made of any ground cellulose product
such as recycled newspaper, can be poured or blown in place.
Because insulation can vary Because insulation can vary
widely in quality as well as basic widely in quality as well as basic
raw material source, several
considerations are important to raw material source, several
considerations are important to
the consumer, contends the the consumer, contends the
engineer. An important performance characteristic to evaluate is
flammability. Acceptable flamflammabiity. Acceptable flam-
mability standards for insulation, established through the
American Society of testing and American Society of testing and
Materials (ASTM), include flame spread, fuel contribution
and smoke development rates. and smoke development rates.
An acceptable product may still An acceptable product may still
be flammable and should not be temperature surfaces such as recessed light fixtures or
furnaces. Materials which are flammable should be installed with in a
flame retardant enclosure such
as flame retardant enclosure such
