There are an increasing number of viruses and other types of malware that are designed to fool you, infect your PC and steal your money. If you've used a computer on the Internet, you've probably urfing away and suddenly a box popped up on your screen saying at you're infected with a box popped up on your screen saying you're maged or needs to be cleaned. It spyware, or that your "registry" is ox also assures you that it and perform hree scan out ne message dix the problem. What should you do?
The first thing you should do is look closly at the message, but on't click it. Where is the message coming from? This will be you first clue that something is amiss. You should never get a legitimate. message from $a_{1}$ rogram that is not installed on your computer! You should never $g$ et a warning about a virus from an anti-virus rogram that you've .ever installed. You won't see messages about spyware, malware or registry problems unless you installed the piece of sofware that is telling you that there is a problem.
Let's say you use "AVG Anti-Virus" (my personal favorite). uddenly, a message pops up saying that you are infected with a irus. If that message is not coming from AVG Anti-Virus - and you sould be able to tell - then you're likely being targeted by a scam. "fressage will probably prompt you to click something to perform free scan" of your computer. What will happen is that the "fake stware" will simulate a scan and report that you're infected...then itl ask you to purchase their software in order to remove the infection. Unfortunately, by running the "free scan," you might have Whast installed a virus that is difficult to remove.

The eligibility criteria for 2007 livestock and crop year losses ha been expanded, for farmers and
ranchers who suffered recen livestock and/or crop loses caused by natural disasters, announced Rebecca Hemphill, Executive Director for the Sherman Count
Farm Service Agency (FSA)> Farm Service Agency (FSA)> George W. Bush signed th Department of State, Foreign Operations and Related Programs Appropriations Act, 2008 (2008 Act). The 2008 Act amended the previous Feb. 28, 2007, to be the Crop Disaster Program Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP) and the Livestock Compensation Program (LCP), the 2008 Act extends the date livestock and livestock
losses could have occurred in primary or contiguous county named in a Secretarial or Presidential disaster declaration to Dec. 31, 2007. "This date change does not eligible for CDP, however it does benefit farmers in that it expands the eligibility criteria to include crops planted in 2007 that were intended for harvest in the same crop year, and it adds 10 months livestock losses can be considered for the new programs," said Hemphill.
