yellow halo when the leaf is held up. to the sunlight. Within two weeks the spots will begin to elongate and become rectangula One distinguishing characteristic of Gray Leaf Spot is the lesion
remain between two veins of the corn leaf. Infection by this fungus may expand to the point of killing entire leaves. Gray Leaf Spot infected plants are more susceptible to stalk rots and
lodging. Plants that have lodged lodging. Plants that have lodged
or fallen over are difficult to harvest.
