If the affidavit is on file, an older homeowner cannot lose a taxes. Once a homeowner files an over-65 tax deferral affidavit with the appraisal district, no taxing unit can start or continue a lawsuit for delinquent taxes as
long as that person owns and lives in that home. The tax deferral only postpones paying delinquent taxes on the home; it does not cancel them.
