With grief, unsolved crimes are part of Bundy legacy

SEATTLE (AP) - After enBundy's smug silence and
denials, relatives of his acknowledged victims found a mission
murder.

three people in Florida, admitted killing 23 other women after a

more.
No one knows the enormity of
Bundy's crimes. FBI officials said years ago he might be im-
plicated in 36 slayings throughout plicated in 36 slayings throughout
