He and his classmates said they bought the cigarettes from a vending machine located in the basement of the Capitol while a security guard stood Raquel Contreras, 11, said, "We think the law should be changed," because, she said, the younger a person starts smoking cigarettes, The bill by Sen. Cyndi Taylor Krier, R-San Antonio, would make i illegal to sell or provide tobacco products to a person under 18 years
old. Tobacco vendors would face a $\$ 200$ fine if found guilty of break ing the statute.
Ms. Krier's bill would also require cigarette vending machines be
located in places supervised by an adult and located in places supervised by an adult and that signs be posted
where cigarettes are sold warning of the dangers of cigarette smoking.
