FERTILIZING WOODY ORNAMENTALS Attractant components in all well landscaped properties. Planned maintenance and care are essen vigorous. An adequate fertiliza tion program is an important re quirement of any good woody plant maintenance program. maintenance program is follow ed, supplemental fertilizer is seldom needed for trees and other woody plants within the lawn area. Occasionally, addiwhere a tree's root growth is restricted by streets, curbs or other structural features. Shrubs
and vines frequently serve as screens or borders for lawn areas within the landscape. Since area around shrubs are usually not as accessible as lawn areas, the
frequently neglected in the normal lawn fer tilization program.
Fertilizer cannot solve problems from improper planting
techniques, poor soil drainage techniques, poor soil drainage
soil compaction and incorrect watering practices. Difficulties caused by species unsuitable for a given environment are not solv-
ed with fertilizers. Select and shrubs to suit the local climate and soil.
Signs indicating low fertility include lack of terminal growth, pale green or yellow leaves, mot ted leaves, dead branches,
stunted leaves and early loss of leaves. General tree vigor is determined by comparing the length of twig growth during the past three to four years.

Most fertilizers are purchased is the percentage of the three major plant nutrients - nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium. The analysis is shown on the bag or container and consists of three
numbers, for example, 12-4-8. The first number indicates the percentage of nitrogen ( $N$ ), the
second gives the percentage of econd gives the percentage of (P2O5) and the third is the percentage of potassium as potash (K2O). A 50 -pound bag of
a $12-4-8$ fertilizer contains six 12-4-8 fertilizer contains six
pounds of $\mathrm{N}, 2$ pounds of P 2 O 5, and four pounds of K 2 O .
Tree growth is limited by a
nitrogen deficiency more often nitrogen deficiency more often than by a lack of the other two
major elements. For this reason, is recommended that a fertilizer with a 2-1-1 or 3-1-1 ratio be used for trees. Fertilizers with a
$2-1-1$ or similar ratio, which usually are available, include 10 -$8-6$ and $12-6-6$. If the desired ratio s unavailable, a 3-1-1 ratio fermixizer can be approximated by 12 ounces of ammonium nitrate ( $33-0.0$ ) to each pound of a 12-12-12 fertilizer. The same type ertilizer can be used on shrubs and vines; however, fertilizer
recommended for lawn use is adequate for these plants. To figure the amount of nitrogen-containing fertilizer off a square or rectangular area that includes the entire branch spread of the trees and shrubs in an area. If roots are restricted by pavement, curb or a building, the total area computed.
The micronutrient most com monly deficient in Texas soils is iron. This deficiency usually is
noted in alkaline soil regions. The iron becomes insoluble and the plant cannot extract sufficient amounts from the soil for good growth. Iron deficiency symp-

DEAR DR GOTT: My doctor says I have a hiatai hernia. He gives me ant-
acids that are no help. What other
treatments are available? DEAR READER: Hiatal hernia is a weakness of the ring of tissue where the esophagus joins the stomach. Or-
dinarily this ring prevents backwash
of irritating stomach acid into the esophagus.
In patients with hiatal hernia, gas-
tric acid enters the esophagus tric acid enters the esophagus, caus-
ing heartburn, indigestion and gas. This backwash is called reflux; it is a ommon condition in odier patients.
Antacids, by neutralizing stomach acid, often help symptoms. Other
therapy includes changing eating paterns (remain upright for at least 30 minutes after eating
more frequent meals)
Also, medicine - such as Tagamet
nd Zantac - suppresses the promer and Zantac - suppresses the produc-
ion of acid, thereby relieving indiges. ion. In extreme cases, doctors may
