person who responded to the mailings by visiting a Freedom Financial time-share condominium, authorities said. The indictment lists 20 incidents in which authorities said residents in Texas, Okiahoma, Louisiana, Missouri, Arkansa nare resorts with promises of valuable prizes. letters guaranteed a new car along with either $\$ 10,000$ cash, gol bullion or a 45 -inch screen color television, the indictment states Wortham said people visiting one of the seven resorts in Texas ooks about the Olympics or redemption certificates. The cer ificates required people to pay shipping and handling charges that cost as much as the retail value of the prize, Wortham said. In October, Freedom Financial Corp. pleaded guilty to con-
spiracy and mail fraud and paid a $\$ 1.5$ million fine. The company also mailed about 2,000 restitution checks of $\$ 50$ each to area residents who complained about the advertisements.

 Southwest Region as threeschools compete for runner-up rights to attend the prestigious College National Finals Rodeo. The final Southwest Region
rodeo begins Thursday in rodeo begins Thursday in
Stephenville, hosted by Tarleton State University.
Odessa College will take first place honors in the region this
season. The Wranglers, who have won seven of the nine rodeos thus far, have a whopping 2.457 .5 points.
The race is much closer for se cond place - which also qualifies for the CNFR. Coach Bob Doty's Western Texas College team is
currently in second and won't be currently in second and won't be
easily disloged. The Westerners easily disloged. The Westerners
have qualified for the finals rodeo eight straight seasons - more
university in the region.
Western enters Thursday's odeo with 1,410 points. A close
second is Tarleton State with 1,348.5. Fourth is Sul Ross State
University with $1,252.5$, followed by Howard College with 1,177.5. The figures are based on each the nine already held. After the final rodeo in Stephenville, teams scores to get season totals. To improve point standings at tephenville, the teams must beter their lowest score of the seven
best. As an example, Western's best seven scores have been a and a 165 for a total 1,410 . To improve that total, the Westerners
must score over 90 points. Tarleton's scores are a 130,150, 190, 157.5, 180, 290 and 250. To im-
prove on its $1,348.5$ total TSU prove on its $1,348.5$ total, TSU
