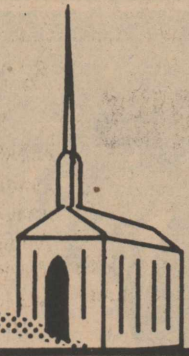

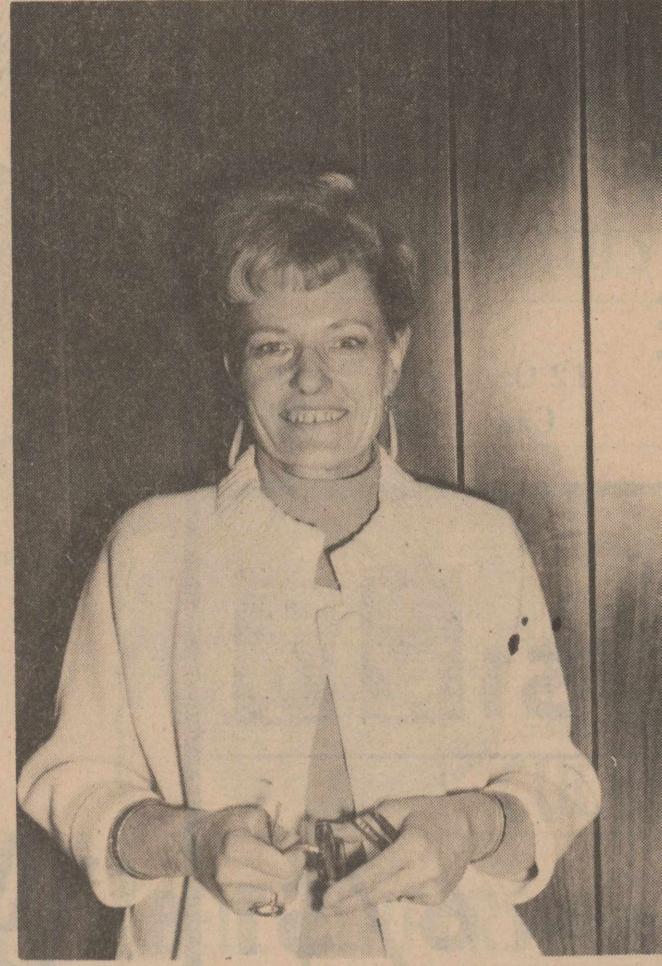

QUICKIE HOT STUFF
2 cans of cream of chicken soup
1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 small diced onion
1 small can chopped green chilles

Mix all ingredients together do not thin soup-Pour one package of doritos in baking dish. Top with soup mixture and grated cheese. Bake at 375 degrees until bubbly.

1 box fresh strawberries, washed, sliced and sprinkled with a couple T. sugar. Refrigerate. May reserve five whole strawberries to decorate top of pie.
1 baked pie shell, cooled
Filling:
2/3 c. sugar
1 stick soften oleo
2 T. flour
3 eggs
1 t. vanilla
pinch of salt
1 1/2 c. milk

Mix sugar, flour, salt with oleo. Add eggs, one at a time. Add milk and vanilla. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until thickened. Cool. Pour into pie shell. Cover with strawberries and top with whipped cream of cool whip. Instant vanilla pudding may be substituted for filling if desired.

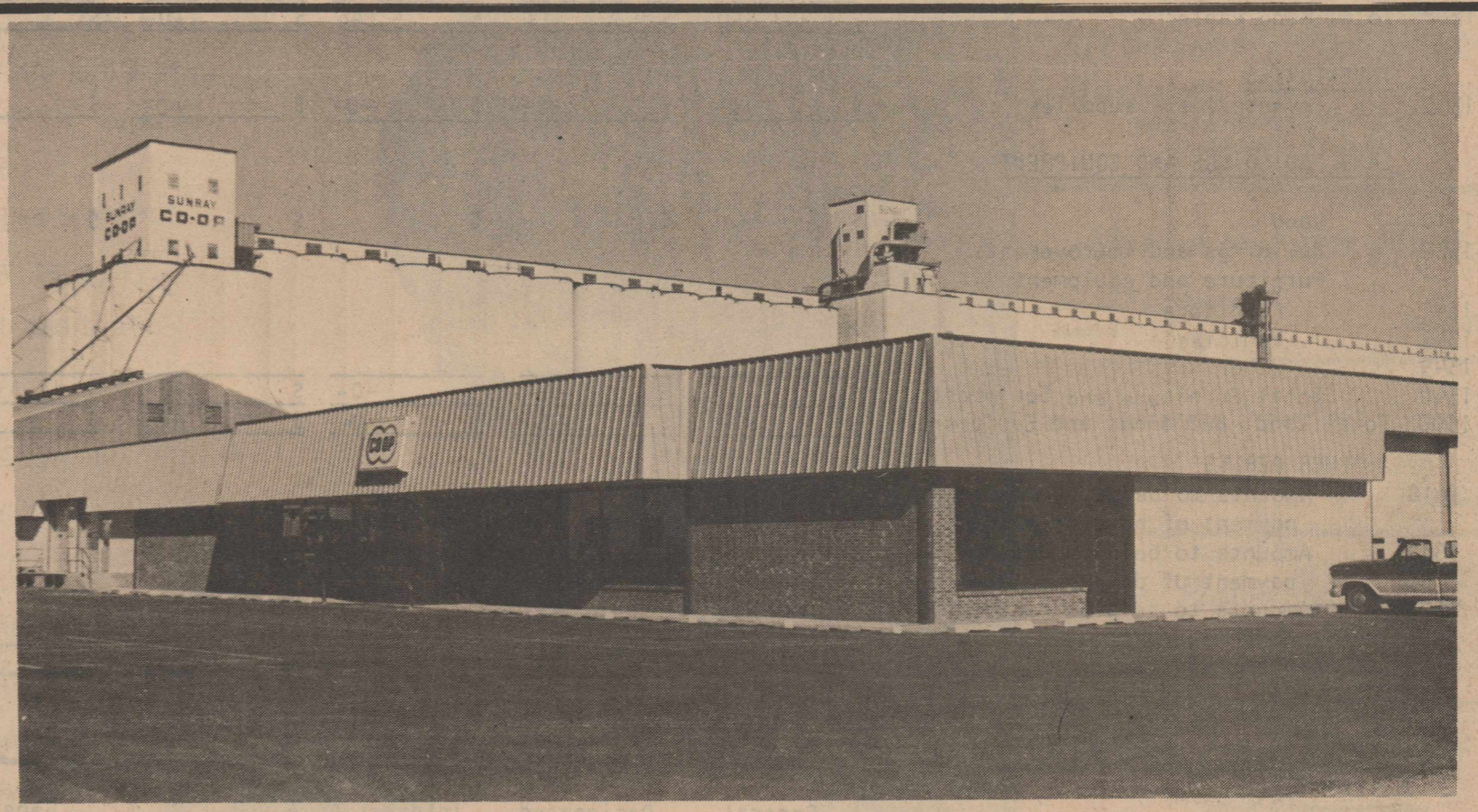
Library Friends Set Dinner For Authors

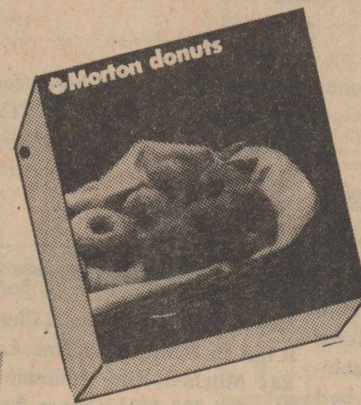

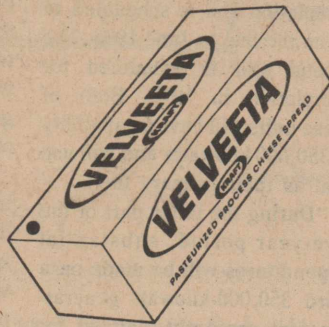
