**ENTHUSIASM SHOWN IN
COUNTY-WIDE SANITATION**

With the enthusiasm shown by the people of Martin county in the sanitary movement it appears now that the men allowed on the project are going to be kept busy until the last minute, filling orders for sanitary closets.

At present seventeen men are pouring slabs and curbs, hauling them, placing same on pits, digging pits and taking new orders for toilets. People are giving orders without being solicited. At present the slabs and curbs are being made at the Higginbotham-Bartlett Lumber Co, but beginning next week the working crew will be found at the Berry lumber yard, at work.

The rural schools of Martin county should by all means take advantage of the opportunity offered them and put in sanitary toilets as recommended by the State Department of Health while the cost is so small. It is only a matter of time when the State Department of Education will make such requirements for state aid schools. Some counties in Texas now require the type of sanitary toilet being placed in Martin county for all state aid.

Todate 77 orders have been received, 31 pits dug, 15 slabs poured and 10 toilets installed.

John E. Fridly, county supervisor said: "We gratefully appreciate the co-operation of Judge Lanar and the county commissioners in helping to carry on what we believe is the most valuable work now being done in Martin county with C. W. A labor."
