



We have suggested that your contract be corrected to the figures on the enclosed slip. If this is agreeable with you sign the slip and return in the enclosed envelope AT ONCE. If not agreeable norify the committee and your contract will be cancelled and returned to you.

All centracts not heard from by Monday, April 30, will be cancelled and returned to the producers
