



# Look What the Buffalos Have to Go Up Against



The sports department of The Reporter, received through the mails Tuesday morning from the Monahans News, the picture here presented of the Monahans Green Wave, (better known as the Monahans Loboes), the squad that the Stanton Buffa-loes are to meet this Friday night on the Monahans lighted field. From the looks of the picture, and from accounts read in newspapers by sport writers that have seen the Green Wave all dressed up in their new uniforms, they are the nattiest dress-ed squad of any in either Class A or B in this part of West Texas.
