4-H Rifle Team Competes in State Match at Victoria

The Rifle Team did a great job shooting in new setting again this year as they made a little trip down to Victoria to shoot on a different kind of range than what they are accustomed to. These kids did a fantastic job and really made a lot of improvement over the last couple of years shooting around the state. Overall the team finished in 13th place this year and improved their team score by 215 points. They also moved up 10 places in the overall standings. This squad is working real hard to regain the glory of the Sherman County Rifle program. Each member improved his or her scores considerably over last year, some by as many as 100 points, and improved in each shooting position. Garrett Ely has anchored this squad for the past couple of years and finished the match just out of the top 10 in 12th place. He shot a 524, 43 points better than last year. Mary Ann Spurlock really showed some progress this spring finishing in 51st with a 451, 105 points better than last year. Conner Lowry the teams one Senior finished in 66th place with a score of 417. He shot 59 points better than last season. And Trenton Stone wound up in 85th place with a score of 369, 82 points more than last year. Each of these shooters has worked hard and their scores show it. With at least one new member joining the team next year, their goal is to move well inside the top team at the State Match. Let's congratulate these shooters on an outstanding season.

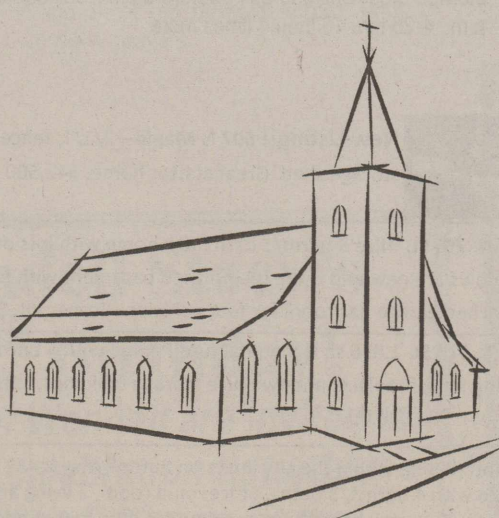
