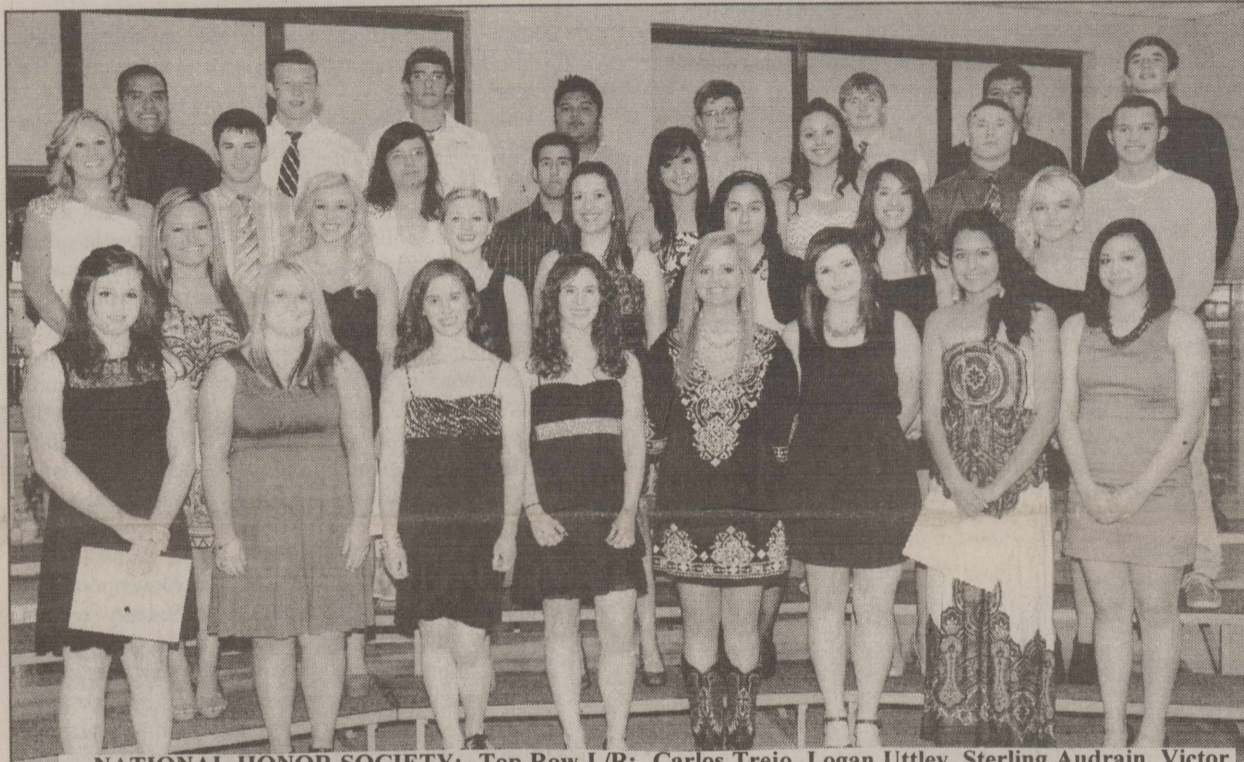

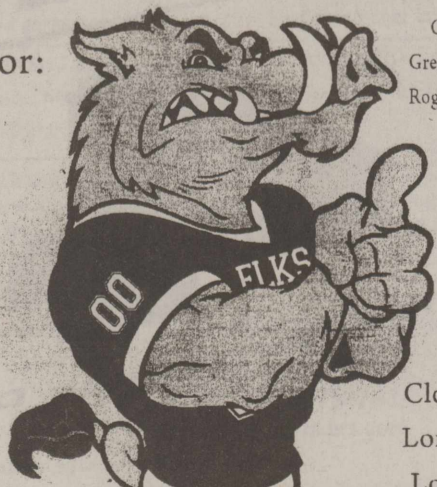

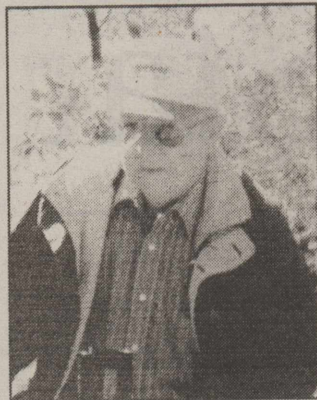

Mr. Stone was born February 19, 1943, in Conlen to Ural George Stone and Bess Wells Stone. He served as mayor of Texline and was on the city council.

## FSA County Committee Nomination Period Begins June 17

(Stratford, TX), June 30, 2013 —Sherman County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Rebecca Lowe, announced that county committee election nominations began on June 17, 2013. Farmers, ranchers and landowners are encouraged to nominate candidates to serve on their local FSA county committee by the August 1, 2013 deadline.

Elected county committee members serve a three-year term and are responsible for making decisions on FSA disaster, conservation, commodity and price support programs, as well as other important federal farm program issues. County committees are comprised of three to 11 members.

"County Committees are unique to FSA and are instrumental in all aspects of federal farm program implementation at the local level," said Lowe.

Producers may nominate themselves or others as candidates. Organizations that represent minority and women farmers and ranchers may also nominate candidates. Nominees must participate or cooperate in a program administered by FSA, be eligible to vote in a county committee election and reside in the local administrative area (LAA) in which the person is a candidate. To become a nominee, eligible individuals must sign form FSA-669A. The form and more information about county committee elections are available online at: [www.fsa.usda.gov/elections](http://www.fsa.usda.gov/elections).

"It is important that county committees are comprised of members who fairly represent the diverse demographics of production agriculture for their community," said Lowe. "All producers, including women, minority and beginning farmers and ranchers are encouraged to participate in the nomination and election process."

Nomination forms must be postmarked or received in the local USDA Service Center by close of business on August 1, 2013.

FSA will mail ballots to eligible voters beginning Nov. 4. The ballots are due back in the local county office by mail or in person no later than Dec. 2. All newly elected county committee members and alternates will take office January 1, 2014.

Something interesting about the Military most people do not know about including me and I served in the military.

It's 11:30 a.m. and Derrick Davenport has been cooking for almost four hours, he's made flounder and scallops with Quinoa and arugula salad. Whipped up some sweet potato soup with squash. Roasted lamb lion and served it in mushroom sauce with butter nut squash puree and edam cheese fritters, baked mini chocolate-butter milk cakes doused them in Chambord and ganache and topped them with milk chocolate cream, now after piling on some meringue and toasting it with a kitchen torch he ferries it in to the dining room, where three stone faced judges wait. Davenport carefully sets a cake in front of each one, the last course he's presented this morning the judges look profoundly unimpressed it might sound like an audition for Top Chef but in fact Davenport is a senior chief petty officer in the US navy one of eighteen culinary specialists chosen to compete for the title of armed forces chief of the year the twenty year old competition takes place. At the joint culinary center of excellence in Fort Lee Virginia, where the military conduct most of its food training services each contestant must make and serve four courses in four hours-Training and testing cooks is something the military takes very seriously.
