



GOSPEL JUBILEE AND CHILI SUPPER

Kerrick Historical Committee will host a gospel music and chili supper fund raiser on Saturday, October 27th at the Murdock School. The meal will be served from 6pm-9pm music will be from 7pm-9pm. The meal is by order; the menu is anything you can do with chili. Adult tickets are \$6.00 and children under 10 are \$4.00. All proceeds are for the restoration of the old school, supplies, insurance and utilities. The music is provided by the Harville Family from Moulton, AL.

The earliest school records found to date for the Murdock School is 1918. The Texas Teacher's Daily Register for the year 1918-1919 does not list the teacher. The Register does document the name of the school as Murdock School No.1, County of Dallam, State of Texas, District No. Eight. Twenty-two students were enrolled for this year.

The teacher's salary was \$720.00 for the year. The teacher wrote that for the year there were no improvement in the building or that no equipment had been provided for the class room since the previous year. The recommendations for the improvement of the work in the room were a "working library."

The following are the teachers that taught in the old Murdock School; Melissa Barentine from 1919 to1920. Hazel Harris from 1920 to 1921. 1921 to1922 was missing in the Dallam County records. Edna M Reese from 1922 to 1923. Frances Louise Skelly from 1923 to1924. Helen Brown from 1924 to1925. 1925 to1926 was missing in the Dallam County records. Mabel Barentine from 1926 to1927. 1927 to1928 was missing in the Dallam County records. Edith Zochert from 1928 to1929 and 1929 to1930. Virgie Taylor from 1930 to 1931 and 1931 to 1932.

The first teachers to teach in the new school were Martin L Stevens and Virgie Taylor. In 1941 parents were transferring their children to the Murdock School. In 1944 families were transferring their children from the Murdock school to Stratford, reason given for transfer was "better school advantages" or "closer and better roads." The attendance fell to the point the local resident petitioned Daliam County for election to consolidate districts. On 15 July 1950 the results of the election was 27 for consolidation and three against.

The old school is eighty and still has good bones. In the eighty years the only major change to the building was moving the boy's bathroom to its present location and building the kitchen. This was done after the school closed in 1950. Work on the new roof will be completed this week, making step one of our renovations complete. Step two was to be the interior outside wall and interior windows but our kitchen has started deteriorating. We have decided that step two must be restoring the kitchen.

We can only reach our goal for the old school with your help. Once the overall goal is completed, with the proper management, the building should not get in its current condition again.

Refreshments will be served and I will stay until I have





We had more than 45 students participate in the ACT Prep Boot Camp at the county barn on October 2. The high school principal and school counselor worked diligently to prepare for the Boot Camp that also included students from a neighboring school. Stratford HS brought the boot camp to Stratford after our students had a successful trip to Dalhart last year. Between the ACT and SAT, we get a pretty good idea who is ready for college-level work. It seems redundant that one of the state's STAAR testing program's goal is to measure college readiness when those types of assessments already exist.

I have to admit I was a bit disappointed in the results of the Tax-Ratification Election. This year's budget is already in place and it will be business almost as usual. We cannot indefinitely fund all of our positions and programs with the state cutting \$525,000 out of this year's revenue. The pre-legislative rhetoric does not look promising for school funding during the Spring 2013 legislative session. The lawsuits against the state concerning funding are beginning this month, but it may take years for appeals to be exhausted no matter what the courts rule initially. We are always hearing that elections have consequences and this one is no different. Either the state will have to restore funding cuts or we have to determine how deep and how quickly we will need to trim approximately \$600,000 (close to 10 percent) out of the budget before we deplete the fund balance to an unhealthy amount. Thanks to all of you that voted.

Our budget issues are not unique to Stratford. All across the state, districts have had TREs. Since 2006, 454 school tax elections have been called in Texas. Over 82% of the districts that have attempted TREs have had voterapproved tax increases. This fall, 29 of the 34 TREs that have been conducted have passed with another nine districts that

Speaking of elections, the board of trustees will also be on this November ballot. Michelle Lutes, Tres Hess, Greg Wright and Brad McBryde will be vying for three positions on the board of trustees. I appreciate each of their willingness to serve. It is a tremendous responsibility to oversee the school district. The raised beds in front of the administration offices have seen some improvement over the past few weeks.

Recently, a parent volunteered their services to the upkeep of the bed and they are looking so much better. If you get a chance to tell Nita Barnard thanks, please do. The flag banners adorning Main Street look fabulous. Thank you to those that participated in the project. I love

the school and community spirit concerning the Elks and Lady Elks. The banners along with the new and improved Main Street have a very classy look. The successes that Stratford ISD has had are a direct reflection of the support and high expectations that the community has given the district over the years. It is an honor and a privilege for me to serve the community, parents, staff, and students of Stratford ISD. Stratford ISD has done a tremendous job of educating the kids of this community for

many years. Again, I want to thank the Stratford community for its support for its school district.






