STUDENTS EXPLORE THE U.S. LEGAL SYSTEM DURING SUMMER FORUM

National Youth Leadership Forum on Law and Crime Scene investigation Provides Specialized insights

WASHINGTON, D.C. — This summer, outstanding high school students from across the United States will take part in a unique career development program in our nation's capital during the six-day program. The National Youth Leadership Forum on Law and Crime Scene Investigation (CSI) will introduce students to challenging careers in the legal profession and forensic science.

"Through intensive simulations, students will have the opportunity to exercise the skills used by Supreme Court justices who rule on key issues facing our country today, in addition to serving as the esteemed legal teams that argue on behalf of and against those issues." said Dr. Marguerite Regan, Dean of Academic Affairs for the National Youth Leadership Forum. "Because our legal system plays a vital role in our daily lives, the National Youth Leadership Forum on Law and Crime Scene Investigation offers students the opportunity to learn directly from partners at law firms, forensic pathologists, criminal defense attorneys and prosecutors, as well as professors and other experts in the legal profession. This is where the future for many students begins to take shape."

The curriculum for the Forum on Law and CSI is based on actual events, which allows students to learn from the examples set by attorneys of law and court officials from municipal court to the U.S. Supreme Court. The process encourages students to develop perspective and resolve. Throughout the Forum, students will examine how court cases often change the legal system.

In the past, the Forum on Law and CSI has visited several law firms and area courthouses, including the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, District of Columbia Superior Court and various county circuit courts. The program has also included visits to some of our nation's most prestigious law schools, including Georgetown Law, The George Washington University Law School and American University Washington College of Law.

Founded in 1992, the National Youth Leadership Forum is an educational organization established to help prepare extraordinary young people for their professional careers. Forums are offered across the United States in a wide variety of career fields, such as national security, law and crime scene investigation and medicine. Over 50,000 young people have attended NYLF programs.





5th Annual Palo Duro Hot Dog 15 K and 3-person Relay to be held

This Saturday, July 14, 2012 will be a special day for the Baeza and Garza families from Stratford. Starting at 8 a.m., the 5th Annual Palo Duro Hot Dog 15K and 3-Person Relay will get underway from the north rim of the Palo Duro Canyon to the south rim on Highway 207 south of Claude, TX. The day will be special because it the 5th running of the race and it is also what would have been Oscar Baeza Sr., our dad's, 65th birthday. On December 18, 2002, a shock reverberated through our entire family and through the town of Stratford. On that fateful day we were blindsided by the news that our dad had taken his own life. It was a devastating blow and was just one week shy of what would have been another fun, silly, and laughter-filled Christmas. After that day, nearly ten years ago, holidays were never the same. Hindsight is 20/20 and although we never imagined it to unfold this way, we realized there were signs that we never followed up on.

Depression is a slippery slope. For some, it could be as simple as a day of feeling blue, for others it can seem like an inescapable black hole that continues to drain your life one day at a time. And it doesn't just happen overnight, but over time depression can change a loved one into someone you don't recognize. In our case, the change was so gradual that we didn't see it till it was too late. Or maybe it was because we thought

we knew our dad. We knew he was a strong man and never let anything keep him down for long. Maybe we figured it was just a rough patch and he would prevail like he always did. Maybe it was just that we never imagined a man so full of joy, life, and laughter would be gone like this.

Treating depression is no different that treating any other type of illness. As one may take insulin for their diabetes, there is a real biological basis for depression too. It also takes patience, love, and support from those closest to help whether it's a support group or Christian counseling. There is a stigma associated with depression or any mental health ailment and it needs to stop. Right now.

The Palo Duro Hot Dog 15K and 3-Person Relay was put together for these purposes. Each year we, brothers and sisters and our families, come together to execute race day. We work aid stations, cook hot dogs, give out awards, and share our story with runners, spectators, and volunteers. The race raises awareness, promotes advocacy, and challenges people to recognize the signs and symptoms of depression and other mental health issues. Monies raised from runners? Registration fees are provided to mental health beneficiaries in the Texas Panhandle to further their outreach in these areas. Donations and sponsorships provide the means to put the event on. This race has a reputation for being challenging, and

HOT! We have a number of runners who come back year after year to better their race times and for the camaraderie that the race provides for

runners and those whose lives have been touched by depression and suicide. Please visit our website, www.palodurohotdog.com today to register for the event or to donate to our cause. You can get involved a number of ways: run the Individual 15K (9.3 miles) or 3-person relay where each team member runs 5K (3.1 miles), volunteer (register on website), donate (every dollar raised touches someone's life!), or just come and offer your support and have fun watching. Private pesticide applicator license training set Aug. 9 in Amarillo

AMARILLO – The Texas AgriLife Extension Service in Potter County is offering private pesticide applicator license training on Aug. 9 at the Texas AgriLife Research and Extension Center, 6500 W. Amarillo Blvd., Amarillo.

The training session begins at 8 a.m., according to Brandon Boughen, AgriLife Extension agent for Potter County. The three and a half hour training will give participants the needed information to take the private applicator license test, which will be administered by the Texas Department of Agriculture. Cost of the training is \$60 and all materials will be provided.

Anyone in the Texas Panhandle may and are encouraged to participate if they need a private pesticide applicator license, Boughen said. The private pesticide applicator license is for agricultural producers and land owners who apply restricted-use pesticides to their own property.

RSVPs are requested by Aug. 3, and can be made by contacting Boughen at 806-373-0713.

CLARENDON — An educational rainwater harvesting seminar, complete with a hands-on installation demonstration, has been scheduled for July 28 in Clarendon, according to Leonard Haynes, Texas AgriLife Extension Service agent for Donley County

The seminar will begin with registration from 8-8:30 a.m. at the home of Sarah Sorelle, 507 W. 5th Street. Sorelle, who is helping sponsor the event, has offered her home as a demonstration location due to her interest in conserving water.

"The hands-on installation demonstration will be led by the world-renowned rainwater harvesting expert, Billy Kniffen, who has presented this topic at several locations across the United States," Haynes said. Kniffen is the AgriLife Extension state rainwater harvesting specialist.

Following the hands-on portion, a meal will be provided along with an educational program at the Donley County Activity Center, 4437N. State Highway 70. The program will end around 3 p.m., he said.

There will be a \$10 registration fee per person. Checks should be made payable to Donley County Texas AgriLife Extension and mailed to Box 682, Clarendon, Texas

Haynes said this meeting is a joint effort between Greenbelt Water Authority, City of Clarendon, Sorelle and AgriLife Extension, and targets communities within the Greenbelt Water Authority — Clarendon, Hedley, Memphis, Childress, Quanah and Crowell — but is open to anyone.

"Not only has the Greenbelt Water Authority identified depletion of water resources as a major concern, but the Texas water-supply planning process has identified that surface and groundwater supplies will not be able to meet future water demand," Haynes said. Water conservation and development of alternative water supplies is necessary to meet

Water conservation and development of alternative water supplies is necessary to meet the growing demand for fresh water, according to Kniffen. Rainwater harvesting is an innovative alternative water supply approach anyone can use. Rainwater harvesting captures diverts and stores rainwater for later use.

Captured rainwater is ideal for use in landscaping, because the water is free of salts, minerals and chlorine and it adds water back into the ground and aquifer, Kniffen said. It is also useful in attracting and providing water for birds, wildlife and livestock and brought into the home for non-potable or potable use.

Implementing rainwater harvesting techniques directly benefits local communities by reducing demand on water supplies, and reducing run-off, erosion and contamination of surface water, he said.

In many communities, 30 to 50 percent of the total water is used for landscape irrigation, Kniffen said. Capturing rainwater for use in the landscape makes efficient use of a valuable resource, reduces water bills and reduces demand on the water supply.


