The election will be held at 6 p.m. in Room 205 of the Pete \& Nelda State District One consists of 51 counties within which there are 49 soil and water conservation districts in the Panhandle Plains region of Texas.
The current ISSWCB member for State District One is Aubrey Russell of Panhandle, TX Russell, who has been a member of the TSSWCB since May, 2003, runs farming an Since its beginning, the TSSWCB has been governed by five board members. Eac respective board member is elected in a convention type election by delegates from soil and water conservation district directors within the state district that the member resides owever, Wi see incer TSSWCB Executive Director
"Elections occur annually to comply with the soil conservation laws of Texas. Th elections are held in state district conventions and TSSWCB members serve two-yea staggered terms. Since this is an odd numbered year, TSSWCB member elections ar being held in State Districts One, Three, and Five," added Iso

Elected State Board members must be 18 years of age or older, hold title to farmland or ranchland, and be actively engaged in farming or ranching. The gubernatorial appointees must be actively engaged in the business of farming, animal husbandry, or other busines belated to agriculture and district.
The TSSWCB is responsible for numerous natural resource conservation efforts, the mos rominent of which is serving as the lead state agency for the prevention, management, and batement of nompoint soum forestry-relate ctivities in Texas

Special Advocates, or CASA, is a nonprofit organization that believes a child's right to a safe and permanent Special Advocates, or CASA, is a nonprofit organization that believes a child's right to a safe and permanent
home should be acted upon by the court in a sensitive, expedient manner. CASA 69 , Inc. provides trained community volunters to represent the child's best interest in the court and serves children in the $69^{\text {th }}$ Judicial District, which includes Dallam, Hartley, Sherman, and Moore Counties.
CASA was founded in 1976 by a Seattle Superior Court Judge who had become familiar with children "lost" in foster care. He then decided to recruit and train volounters in the community to be fact finders and step into the courtroom to speak up for the child. In 1985, District Judge Bill Sheehan (69' Judicial District) Learned of this
program at a seminar for Juvenile Justice. He felt that a CASA program in the $69{ }^{\prime \prime}$ Judicial District could help him also make quality decisions regarding the future of children in the court system that were abused and neglected. Because of Judge Sheehan's efforts, CASA 69 was born in 1986, and became the first rural CASA program in the United States. Judge Sheehan was also a founding member of Texas CASA in 1989, serving as
its board president for several years. a volunteer from Stratford. "I knew I wanted to be a part of it though I had no idea of how it would bless me in the process. I've had an opportunity to help children who didn't have anyone who cared and needed that little bit of stability in their lives."
"I've been with one particular family for $16^{1 / 2}$ years. They have gone through seven caseworkers in the foster
system over the years, but I am the only one who has known them all the way through since they entered the system. I'm the only one who remembers what they like to do, where they like to eat, and where they like to go. That's what CASA is all about," says Lynn emphatically.
In honor of 25 years in this community, CASA would like to invite members of the community to a

convictions." Dave suffered extreme abuse at the hands of his mentally disturbed alcoholic mother, and nearly died as a child. Years later, his case was identified as one of the most gruesome and extreme forms of child abuse in Califormia history at that time. Dave was placed in a series of foster homes at age 12, and finaliy, at age 18, enlisted in the Air Force. There, he was hand-picked to refuel the highly secretive SR-71 Blackbird and the
F117 Stealth Fighter, both playing major roles in Operation Just Cause, Desert Shield and Desert Storm During F177 Stealun fighter, both playing major roles in Operatint Just cause, Dase made a point to serve in the community, and he was a recipient of the JC Penny Golden Rule Award, making him California Volunteer of the Year

## FORAGE MANAGEMENT FOR COW-CALF PROGRAMS By Brad Easterling <br> Kerrick News <br> By Marylou McDaniel

Many cows in Texas need a higher level of body condition at calving and breeding to improve reproductive Both the quantity and the quality of forage available to the cow largely deterdine her productivity, her need for suppl
A typical cow-calf pair requires about six tons of forage a year. Unfertilized land typically will produce one to one and one-half topn of plant dry matter annually
with an extra ton of forage generally being produced with with an extra ton of forage generally being produced with
each 50 pounds of actual nitrogen fertilizer. Land needed to produce feed for a cow-calf pair largely depends on added fertilization with needed rainfall and to some extent on the mature size of the cattle and the type of forage
involved. Of course we generally do not apply much if involved. Of course we generally do not apply much if
any fertilizer to native pasture, but much higher production and stocking rates can be achieved by fertilizing improved grasses.
Quantity in pastures is measured by the volume of forage present. The rate of gain on growing cattle or
the condition gain or loss on a cow is directly related to stocking rate - - acres of grazing available per cow - - or to the grazing pressure, the amount of forage dry matter available per acre for each 100 pounds of animal weight. least 14 percent body fat) at calving and through moree (at is required for good reproductive through breeding Overstocking pastures is a common cause of poor body condition and reproductive failure.
A successful forage program will provide quantity and quality properly matched to the requirements
of the cattle. Proper stocking, year-round mineral supplementation and timely use of protein supplements offer the greatest potential for economically improving body condition scores and rebreeding performance of beef cows.
