

With this in mind, we have had a few other citizens indicate they would like to donate to the City for the purpose of Main Street decorations. Currently we are trying to raise funds to place banners on the light poles downtown. In the spirit of revitalization and community efforts, the City Council would like to invite all citizens to join them in a clean-up effort around town. 

Warm Harvest Bread Salad

- 1 one-pound loaf artisan bread, preferably a day old
- 1 to 2 tablespoons olive oil 2 shallots, minced
- I teaspoon sugar
- tablespoons pear vinegar or
- apple cider vinegar 1 teaspoon fresh thyme
- leaves 4 to 5 tablespoons extra
- virgin olive oil 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 firm-ripe pears 3/4 cup pitted black olives. halved
- 3/4 cup cherry tomatoes.
- quartered 3 tablespoons minced fresh Italian parsley

Broil the bread until toasted. tear into two inch pieces and set aside. Put the shallots into a bowl with 1 teaspoon salt; sugar, vinegar and olive oil. Pour half of the mixture over the bread. Sauté the pears in butter, then add to the bread with the remaining ingredients. Add the rest of the dressing.

Serve with the roasted chicken recipe available at www.discovercaliforniawine.com (click on CA Wine Month). Pair the white meat with Chardonnay, the dark meat with Pinot Noir. To serve just one wine, consider a dry rosé.





The next two weeks will be a blur - lots to do and the activity calendar is full. Junior high basketball is going full speed and the high school round ballers will be in tournaments. We have the fourth-grade musical and the band concert to showcase our kids' talents. And then there are all of the Christmas parties to attend. When do we find the time to shop for all of those gifts?

You would think since I am in my third year here. I would quit being amazed when I walk through our campuses. But I still see phenomenal things happening in our classrooms daily. Our teachers and students remain engaged in the educational process. Although Smart board technology is changing our classrooms, it isn't much good without a quality teacher leading the classroom. I am encouraged by the cooperation among campuses, staff, grade levels, etc. Our kids and community are so fortunate to have a great staff working with our students.

Good news about Stratford ISD and all of our campuses continues to pour in. We are still proud of our exemplary performance during the 2010 year. The Texas Education Agency recently released Gold Performance Acknowledge and the district and all of the campuses made a good haul on the recognition. **Stratford ISD** was recognized for the following: Attendance, College Ready, Recommended High School Program, and Texas School Initiative Math: **Stratford High School**: Attendance, College Ready, Commended Social Studies, Recommended High School Program, and TSI Math: **Stratford Junior High**: Attendance, Commended Writing, and Comparable Improvement. Reading: **Mary Allen Elementary**: Commended Math, Commended Writing, and Comparable Improvement Math, Congratulations to the district and campuses for another job well done.

The recent audit report gave the district a clean bill of health. Not many school districts can boast concerning the financial soundness of the school district's budget, fund balance and indebtedness. The Board of Trustees and administration continue to commit to fiscal responsibility with the taxpayers' dollars. Although we will never have 100° agreement on expenditures, we will continue to fund things that improve student performance, including upgrading facilities while providing a quality education for the students of community. None of this is possible without the local support of our taxpayers.

This spring's state legislative session promises to be an interesting one. The state is looking a budget deficit that could result in cuts in many of state services, including education. I am comforted in knowing that Stratford ISD is in better shape than most districts and hope to be able to weather these circumstances due to the soundness of our finances. But I will have a watchful eye towards Austin this spring and try to spend some time with Representative Four Price and Senator Kel Seliger concerning the legislative impact to our community.

Café Elk did a great job of getting me into the holiday eating shape the Friday before Thanksgiving. Both cafeterias prepared an amazing meal. Mom and the mother-in-law were hard-pressed to do better. The community participation in the event was outstanding as always.

We had an excellent Stratford ISD Education Foundation annual meeting last month. After a rough stock market the last couple of years, the foundation's bottom line has improved. Currently, it has over \$300,000 in the bank and has given out over \$50,000 in grants since 2002 - Great accomplishment for our community. The principal in the

account generates the interest that is used to fund grants. The larger the principal the more interest will be available for our kids' educational opportunities. Thank you community for all of your contributions to the fund.

The Education Foundation sponsored another Distinguish Lecture for the high school students recently. I enjoy listening to the former Stratford High School students tell their stories. It is a tribute to our school system and community when our products find success after graduation and make it good in the world.

The district also appreciates individuals that donate funds and time to the school. We have been blessed with support on many activities that broaden our students' experiences only because of individual community member's contributions. Thanks to those who have contributed.

Basketball has gotten off to a great vart. The junior high teams are playing well, while the varsities continue to prepare for the district schedule. The Lady Elks recently placed third at the Vega tourney, while the Elks open their season in Vega by winning the championship of the 65th annual tournament. Lots of basketball to be played over the next two months – come out catch a game and eat a band burger.

As a proud WT alum, I attend most of the Buffalo football home games. This year has



been a special treat as we get to see and listen one of our ex-students perform with the Buffalo Marching Band during pregame and at halftime...another great example of our students doing well after high school.

If you didn't make it to the district's Veterans Day Assembly on November 11th, you missed a special time of honoring those that have served us and gave us the chance to be free. Thanks to the guest speaker, along with student council kids and their sponsors. It is a story that needs to continue to be told – all that we enjoy as Americans comes with a price.

Our Elementary and Junior High UIL Academic students did a tremendous job at the district academic meet last month in Vega and Sunray. We had many district champions with another solid performance from our students.

It is an honor and a privilege for me to serve the community, parents, staff, and students of Stratford ISD. Stratford ISD has done a tremendous job of educating the kids of this community for many years. After completing graduation requirement, our kids have doors opened to them to pursue employment, military option or further their education. 




