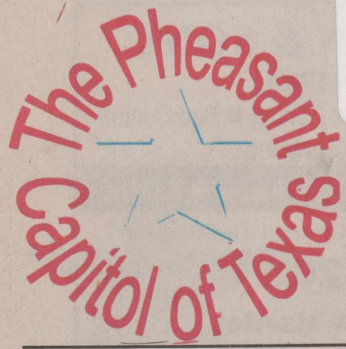
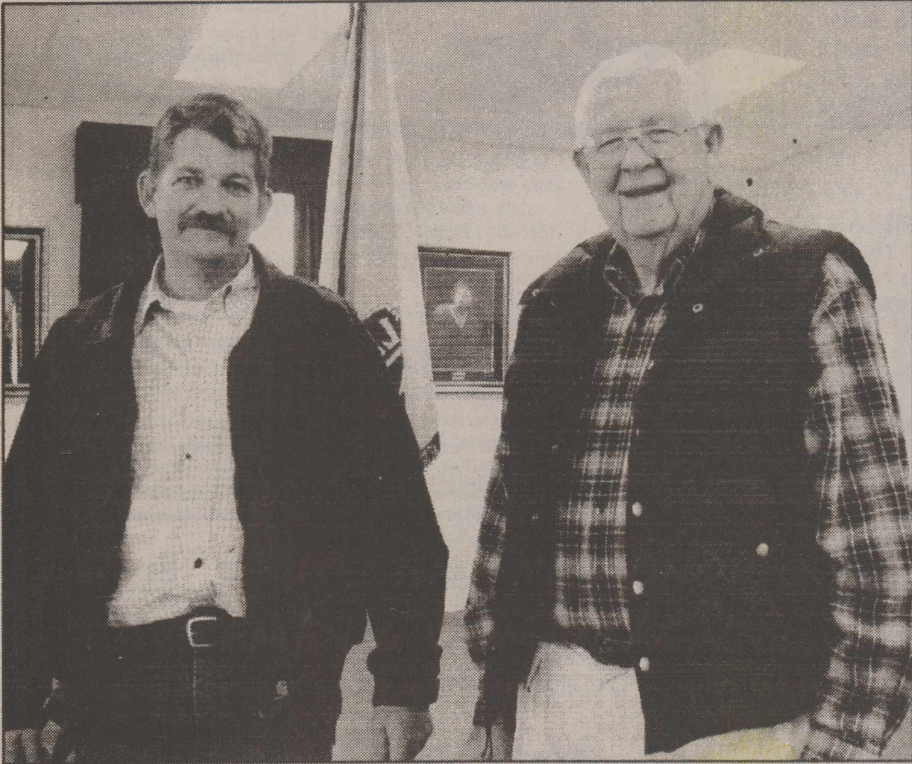

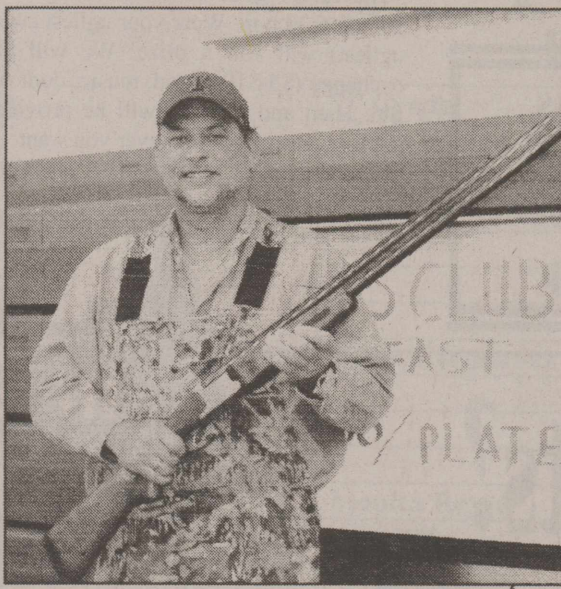

Swiedom shares experiences

She described how these children who have been placed in foster care must deal with repeated changes in their lives — change in foster homes, change of schools, change of newly formed friends and acquaintances. US 287 detour has been partially repaired. Remember hot mix season ended in October and now weather has to be warm like 70 degrees.

US287 will be built the same as Main Street with hot mix and then concrete so who knows when that will be? The warm weather in November was missed because the crew had another job. That seems to be the continuing story.

The rebar stored on 2nd street across from The Imagination Station was moved Saturday, December 4 about 4:00 p.m. It was cut up and moved on a trailer pulled by a red pick-up driven by a Hispanic man and young boy. I understand there was a white pickup and several others helping in the removal. We all assumed it was the concrete crew, if you have information and know where it went, please call city hall. That may cause another hold up on the highway project.

I am afraid the 4 lane of US 54 is history at least from Texhoma to Dalhart. Twenty feet of right of way was lacking for the 4 lane divided to connect to the 4 lane at Texhoma. There were also double pole utilities to be moved.

Now there are double steel pole transmission lines all the way to Dalhart in what would be a right of way for a 4 lane highway. Who was paying attention? Not me! Of course it would have been up to the counties to acquire the right of way. Future expansion plan ahead...

Crispy Macaroons

1 cup sweetened condensed milk
1 cup cornflakes
1 cup crisped rice cereal
1 cup coconut

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees Fahrenheit. Stir the cornflakes, rice cereal and coconut together. Add the sweetened condensed milk and mix well. Use a tablespoon to drop dough onto a lightly greased cookie sheet, keeping cookies about two inches apart. Bake the cookies for eight to ten minutes, or until golden brown. Cool the macaroons on a cookie sheet for two minutes, then place the cookies on wire rack to cool completely.

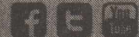

Conservation applications for financial assistance being accepted at NRCS

Applications for funding opportunities with the USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) and Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program (WHIP) are currently being accepted at all NRCS offices across Texas.

NRCS in Texas has received its initial allocation of program funding recently and will begin obligating CSP contracts after January 7 and EQIP and WHIP contracts after Jan. 28, 2011.

"These programs support conservation of private agricultural lands by providing payments for maintaining and enhancing natural resources," said NRCS District Conservationist Rodney Weiser.

EQIP is a "working lands" conservation program that assists private landowners with conservation measures that address priority resource concerns as identified by local farmers and ranchers. The practices that are included, but not limited to are: flow meters, practices associated with increased irrigation water management, micro irrigation, chemigation valves, irrigation pipelines both new install and replacement of old, center pivot conversion, conversion from row water to pivot, pivot replacement, livestock water facilities and pipelines, water wells, pumping facilities, fences, range planting, and many others.

WHIP is designed to benefit wildlife on primarily wildlife land although agriculturally productive operations may qualify for funding.

CSP rewards farmers and ranchers for current conservation management and encourages additional practices and enhancements to further benefit the environment and reduce priority resource concerns.

All of NRCS Farm Bill Programs are voluntary and have a continuous sign-up with periodic ranking cut off periods. NRCS encourages any person interested in participating in their programs to contact their local field office, usually located at the county seat.

The NRCS administers both programs and provides technical assistance to landowners. 2010 represents the 75th year of NRCS "helping people help the land." Stratford 7th and 8th Grade Band Students "Undeclared" In All-Region Band Auditions
