Gary Pool, 58, of Stratford, died Monday, February 24, 2014.

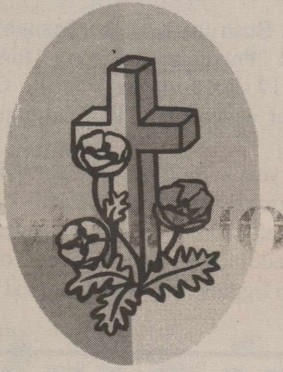

Bernice Christian

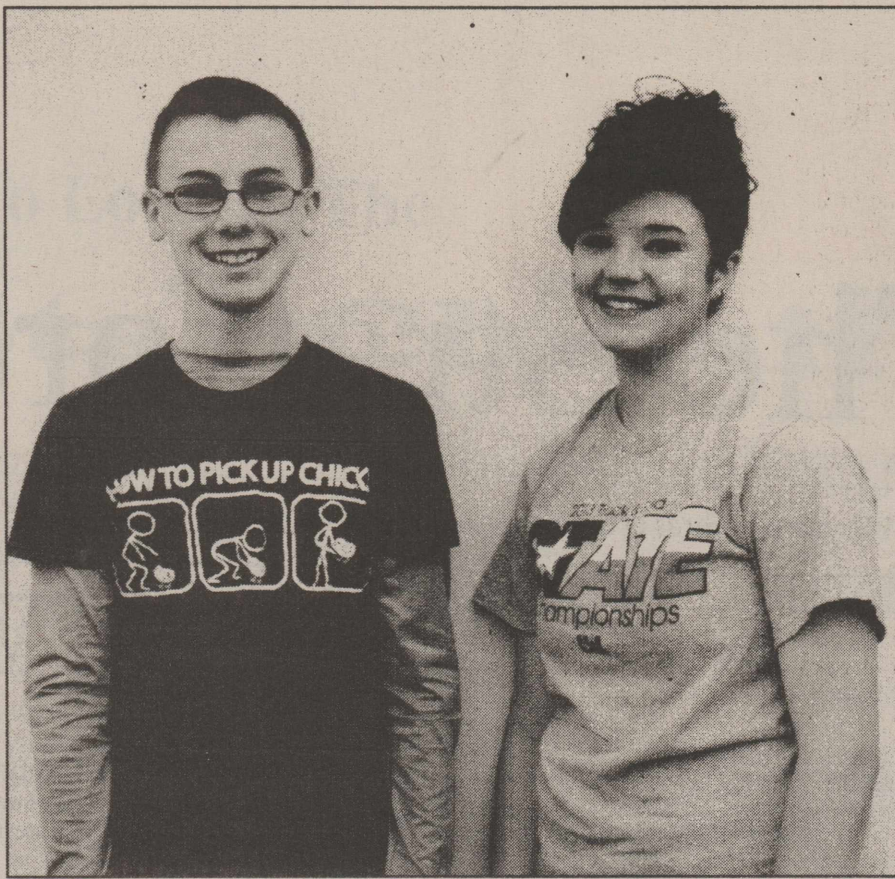
October 29, 1932 February 25, 2014

Stratford Police Chief Aaron Sheehan attends prestigious Department of Justice program

Specialized course about resources available to Stratford Police Department teaches valuable tactics in protecting and saving children

Stratford Police Chief Aaron P. Sheehan, of Stratford Police Department, just returned from the prestigious Chief Executive Officer Training Seminar, held just outside of the nation's capital, at the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) located in Alexandria, VA. After receiving an invitation to attend the specifically designed training seminar for Law Enforcement Executives, 911 Emergency Center managers and Clearinghouse Managers, Chief Aaron P. Sheehan attended the program on Sunday & Monday, February 23-24, as a guest of the NCMEC.

Chief Sheehan joined 56 other Chiefs, Sheriffs, and 911 Emergency Managers who were also selected and invited, to attend the 151st session of the CEO course, and Chief Sheehan is now one of nearly 6,000 who have completed this training.

The Missing & Exploited Children Seminar for Chief Executives was designed to provide attendees like Chief Sheehan a better understanding of the issue of missing and sexually exploited children - and how to specifically deal with the situation of a child who's been reported missing - when time is critical.

"This has been one of the most valuable experiences for me in my 16 years as a law enforcement officer," said Chief Aaron Sheehan. "To have been selected in itself, was an honor, but to be able to bring this knowledge home and put it into practice, is a plus for the citizens of Stratford and the Texas Panhandle.

Created in 1997 and funded by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice Delinquency (OJJDP), the CEO training discusses the needed steps in implementing best practices for call takers, responding officers, investigators, and Command Staff.

Once candidates are selected to attend, all travel and lodging expenses during training are covered by the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children through a grant by OJJDP.

Sheriff Joe Powell graduates from Leadership Command College

Sheriff Joe Powell, of the Sherman County Sheriff's Office, recently graduated from the Leadership Command College - Class 70 of the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas. The program, taught by a consortium of universities throughout Texas, provides law enforcement administrators and executives with the skills necessary to effectively manage police agencies and deliver a high level of service to their communities. Module I, focusing on leadership, is taught at the Center for Executive Development at Texas A&M University. Module II at Texas Woman's University focuses on the political, legal, and social environment of law enforcement. The program concluded on February 28, 2014 with training in law enforcement administration at the third module, held at Sam Houston State University.

Each of the three 3-week modules attended by participants in the program is taught by top national and international law enforcement experts. Topics include leadership, professional ethics and integrity, communication, and personnel management issues. The Command College curriculum also strives to keep participants on top of contemporary issues in Criminal Justice.

This program is one of many offered by the Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas, headquartered on the campus of Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas. The Institute, known as "LEMIT," has been training law enforcement managers and executives since its inception in 1987. LEMIT offers numerous seminars, training for police chiefs, and the leadership program, which is one of the premiere law enforcement academies in the nation. No tax monies are necessary to support LEMIT, which is funded by a surcharge on criminal court costs; affording eligible Texas Law Enforcement managers and executive's essential professional development. Between one and two thousand Texas law enforcement personnel benefit from LEMIT training each year.

XIT Rural Telephone Announces 63rd Annual Membership Meeting

XIT Rural Telephone Cooperative, Inc. has scheduled its 63rd Annual Membership meeting of its rural landline telephone members for Wednesday, March 12th. The meeting will be held at the Rita Blanca Lake Coliseum. Rural landline members' and invited guests' registration will begin at 11:00 a.m. and will be followed with a noon luncheon catered by The Loose Caboose in Dalhart. Once again members and invited guests will be treated to a sit-down dinner served by XIT's management and employees.

The recipients of the 2014 XIT Rural Telephone Educational Program will be announced. This is the fifteenth year that XIT has offered this program to rural members' graduating seniors. Seven area seniors have been chosen this year to each receive a \$2,000 scholarship.

The business session will begin at 1:00 p.m. with a welcome to the membership and an introduction of the guests by J.W. McClellan, President of the XIT Board of Directors. The business meeting will conclude with the election of directors and the drawing of door prizes.

This year, approximately \$4,000 worth of door prizes will be given to attending members. There will be six grand prizes awarded: 1 - \$500 cash prize and 3 - \$300 cash prizes and 2 - \$100 cash prizes. There will also be a kids' drawing. This is for members' children or grandchildren who are 12 years old or younger. Members are reminded that they must be present to win any prize.

The purpose of the annual meeting is to elect directors for each district - to present for approval the reports for the previous fiscal year, and to transact such other business that might come before the meeting.

According to the bylaws, a written notice will be mailed from XIT's business office not less than ten nor more than twenty days before the meeting. This notice was mailed to all active members of the Cooperative on February 21st.

A quorum must be present in order for the business meeting to convene. Based upon the total number of the Cooperative's members, fifty members or two percent of the members present, whichever is larger, constitutes a quorum.

The officers and board members are: J.W. McClellan, President; Walter E. Lasley, Vice President; Gary Finch, Secretary-Treasurer; James R. Wilson, Marcia French, Nick Olson, Steve Baskin, Gared McBryde, and Barry Poling.

On February 6, 2014, the Nominating Committee consisting of Allan Frerich, Tom James, Larry Kemp, Ashley Siebert and Jack Haile submitted

nominations for three directorships. Jack Haile was selected as chairman of the Nominating Committee. Nominations for the following districts were: District I, Dallam County - Marcia French, District II, Hartley County - Phil Haaland and James R. Wilson; and District III, Sherman County - Walter E. Lasley. Members vote only for nominees from the district in which they reside, or the district in which they have telephone service. All members must be present at the annual meeting to vote since no proxy voting is permitted. Either a husband or wife is eligible to vote at the annual meeting, but only one vote is allowed per membership.

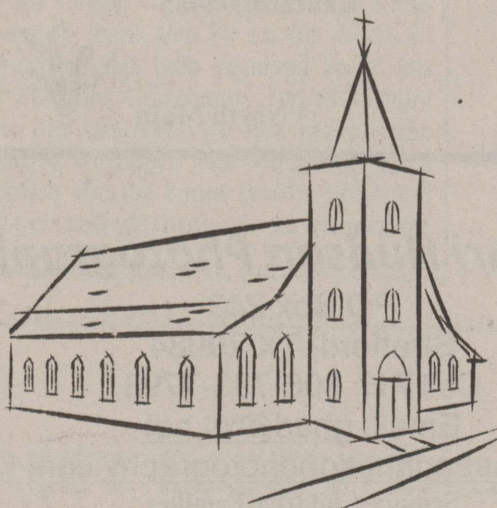

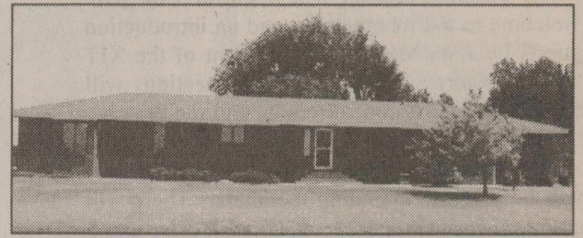
