### Benefits

This system is not meant to replace current emergency notification systems such as sirens, weather alert radios, local television or radio – but to add another method of communicating to the cell phones of a very mobile region.

Receive messages wherever you are regarding critical events occurring in your community via text messages or emails. For individuals who do not use texting or email – messages of importance can be sent to them via voice message on their landlines.

Family Members can register to receive message for elderly parents – they can assist local emergency management by contacting those parents and passing on the important information.

During wildfires, messages can be sent to keep families aware of the changing situation so evacuation is timely.

Following a tornado, messages can be sent to notify families of locations to shelter, find food or receive assistance.

During winter weather, messages can be sent to notify people of road or highway closures.

If a child or elderly is missing, messages can be sent out quickly and also targeted to a specific area through the mapping option.

Residents can sign up to receive weather information at the same time. These messages can be received via text message and email directly from the National Weather Service.

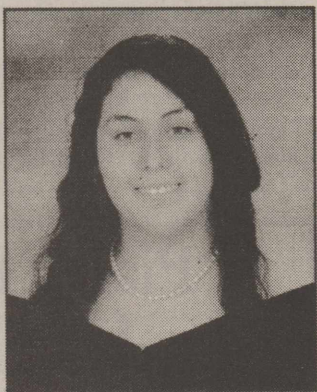

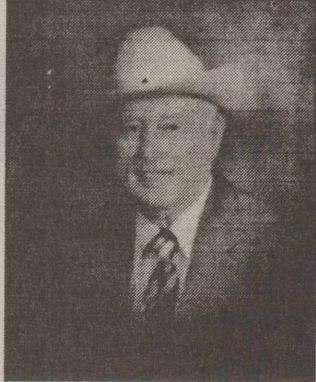
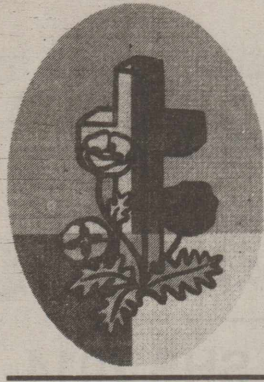
Dear Readers,

## Obituaries



### Albert Leroy Judd July 30, 1918 - May 3, 2014

July 30, 1918 was a busy day for Dr. Lamar. He delivered a little girl to the Williby's then rushed to their neighbors, the Frank Judd's, and delivered a baby boy, Albert Leroy "Sparky" Judd was born about 8 miles NW of Texhoma, Texas Co., OK to Franklin Arthur and Mary Margaret Hubbard Judd. He had an older brother, Arthur, and a younger sister, Mildred. There was also a baby brother who died in infancy, Robert. Leroy, as he was always known, was a thin child and wore braces on his legs when he was young. As he grew he left the braces behind, and loved to run. He was a good athlete, enjoying football, basketball and track in high school. After high school graduation in 1936, he cowboied for Judd Cattle Company for a few years.

One evening he walked down the stairs at church and beheld a beautiful young lady. He discovered she was an old friend, neighbor and playmate who had moved back to the area. Leroy went to work to win her heart ... and her daddy's approval. On December 7, 1941, Leroy and Enid Oleen Anderson ran off and got married in Spearman, Hansford Co., TX. Oleen had TB and her parents had thought her too sick to marry, but Leroy thought one day with her would be better than years with anyone else.

Leroy was called to defend his country in World War II. They stayed together until he was deployed. For the next almost 3 years they wrote each other daily. When the war was over Leroy came home to his bride (and her now approving parents).

Leroy and Oleen lived in the Stratford, Sherman Co., Texas area, farming and ranching with his dad. There they raised three daughters and one son. For several years, they moved to the Hugo, Colorado area in the summer time running cattle there. Many fond family memories were made there.

Leroy and Oleen were active in their community. They were instrumental in establishing the Assembly of God Church in Stratford and played an active part in its growth and development. Leroy served on the School board for several years and the Coldwater Manor Nursing home board for several years. After their children were grown and scattered, they enjoyed traveling to visit them and watching the grandchildren in their activities.

Leroy and Oleen had been married 50 years when Oleen passed away. Leroy grieved. But God provided comfort for him in Barbara Hawkins who had lost her husband several years earlier. They were married and traveled together through life for 22 years. When Barbara had health issues and was no longer able to care for the both of them, they moved into Coldwater Manor where they made their home.

It was under the warm and tender care of the staff at Coldwater Manor and with Barbara and three of his children with him that Leroy took his leave of his earthly body and grasping Jesus' hand, made his way to heaven on May 3, 2014. He leaves behind him 4 children and their spouses, 10 grandchildren and their spouses and 32 great-

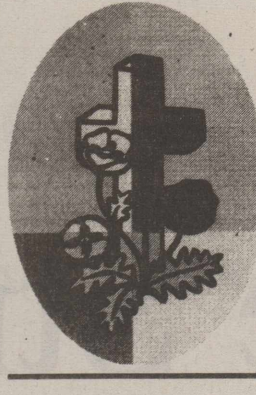
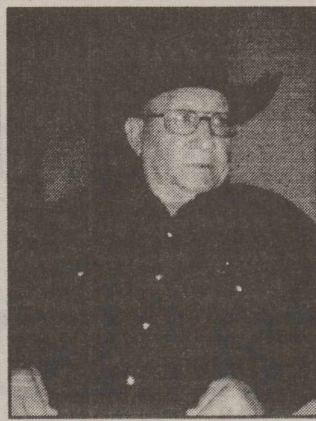

## ORDER PROHIBITING OUTDOOR BURNING

WHEREAS, the Sherman County Commissioners' Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners' Court of Sherman County, pursuant to Local Government Code §352.081, and other applicable statutes, as follows:

1. All outdoor burning is prohibited in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the effective date of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court.

2. This Court may terminate the prohibition on outdoor burning prior to the expiration of 90 days if this Court determines that drought conditions no longer exist. The County Judge is also hereby designated, pursuant to Local Government Code §352.081(e), to terminate the prohibition on outdoor burning prior to the expiration of 90 days if the Judge determines that drought conditions no longer exist.

3. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:

1. firefighter training;
2. public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations;
3. planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Natural Resources Code §153.048, and meet the standards of Natural Resources Code § 153.047.
4. In accordance with Local Government Code §352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

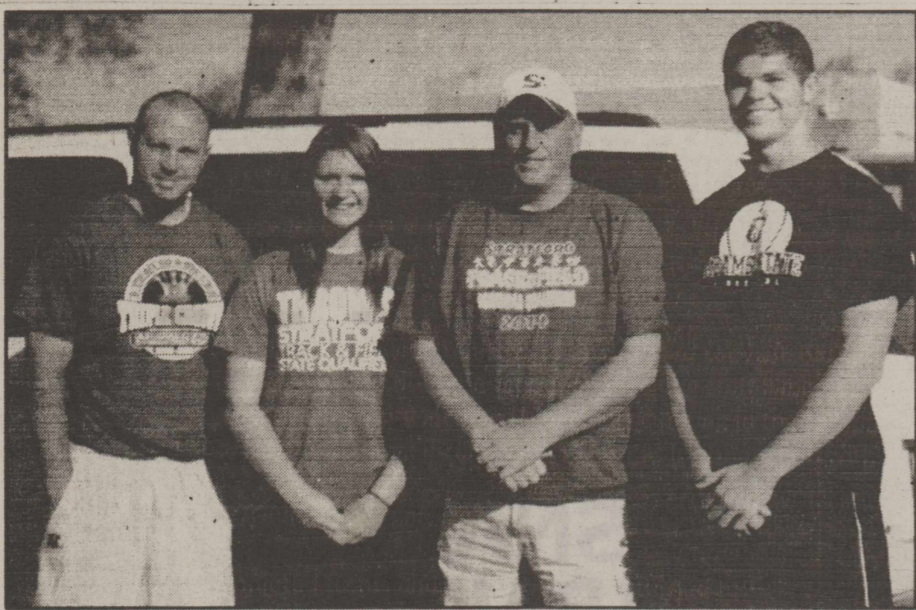

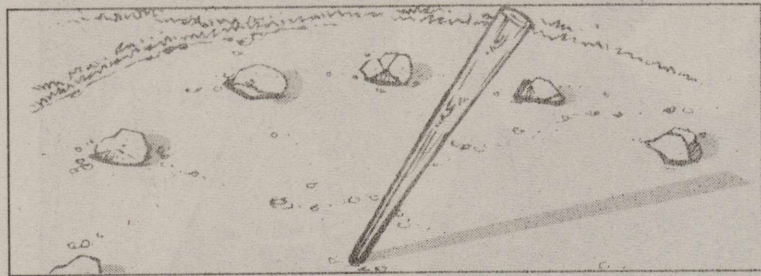

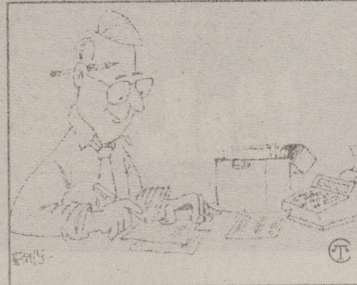
