Burr Wins State and All Around Title

Preston Burr, son of Ed and Christy Burr, won the State Championship in Bareback, as well as, All Around Cowboy during the Texas High School Rodeo Associations State Finals. The T.H.S.R.A. State Finals were held June 8-14th in Abilene, TX. The top 10 contestants from the ten regions of Texas competed for the title of State Champion. During this week, Preston competed in Bareback, Saddle Bronc, Steer Wrestling and Team Roping. Due to his championship win, Preston has earned a position on the Texas National High School Rodeo Team and will be traveling to Rock Springs, WY. July 13-19. During this time, he will compete in the 66th annual National High School Finals Rodeo in Bareback Riding. This event will feature more than 1,500 contestants from 42 states, five Canadian Provinces and Australia; the NHSFR is the world's largest rodeo. In addition to competing for more than \$200,000 in prizes, NHSFR contestants will also be competing for more than \$350,000 in college scholarships and the chance to be named an NHSFR National Champion. To earn this title, contestants must finish in the top 20-based on their combined times/scores in the first two rounds- to advance to Saturday evening's final round. National champions will then be determined based on their three-round combined times/scores. Along with great rodeo competition, these rodeo athletes will have the opportunity to enjoy shooting sports, contestant dances, Cinch Field Day, and church services sponsored by the Fellowship of Christian Cowboys. USDA Authorizes Emergency Grazing of CRP Acres for Sherman County

(Stratford, TX) - June 23, 2014 - Sherman County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director, Rebecca Lowe today announced that Sherman County was authorized for emergency grazing use of Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acres for fiscal year (FY) 2014.

Unlike previous years, counties are not automatically approved for CRP emergency grazing when they reach the D2 (severe drought) level on the U.S. Drought Monitor. If there is a need for emergency grazing, each local FSA Office must request approval from the Texas FSA State Committee. Currently, 59 counties have received emergency grazing approval. The 90-day emergency grazing period for these counties will end Sept. 11, 2014.

Based on a policy decision made by the Texas FSA State Committee, CRP acres grazed during fiscal year 2012 or 2013 will be considered eligible for emergency grazing if NRCS verifies, on a case-by-case basis, that the conservation cover will sustain grazing. FSA's fiscal year runs from October 1 to September 30.

"Eligible producers who are interested in emergency grazing of CRP must request approval before grazing eligible acreage and must obtain a modified conservation plan from the Natural Resources Conservation Service that includes grazing provisions," said Lowe. "Current provisions allow grazing on 100 percent of a field, up to the 75 percent stocking rate," she said.

There will be no CRP annual rental payment reduction for 2014 emergency grazing authorizations.

To take advantage of the emergency grazing provisions, authorized producers can use the CRP acreage for their own livestock or may grant another livestock producer use of the CRP acreage. The eligible CRP acreage is limited to acres located within the approved county.

Additionally, CRP land located within the Lesser Prairie Chicken Critical Habitat Assessment Tool (CHAT) zones I, II and III will only be able to practice managed or routine grazing, managed harvesting, emergency haying or emergency grazing one out of every three years. This frequency regulation resets in 2014, meaning that any land hayed or grazed in prior years that meets the available forage requirement according to NRCS standards will be eligible for emergency use in 2014.

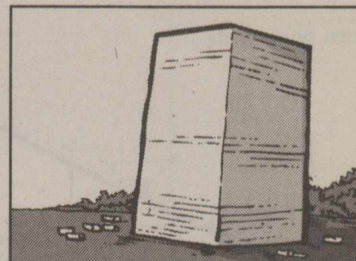

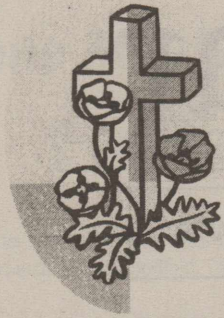

Salma is the 7-year-old daughter of Sarah Ortega, and sister to Baruc, Vinny and Lui. At birth Salma suffered two strokes which left her partially paralyzed on the left side of her body. Her family was told that there was a high possibility that she would never walk, talk or see. But Salma is a very determined little girl and defied all odds. Throughout her life she has undergone physical, occupational, and speech therapy; and by one and one-half years old Salma was walking.

But her struggles were far from over. In 2012 Salma began having epileptic seizures. The young family began regularly traveling to El Paso and Dallas to see pediatric specialists in neurology and neurosurgeons.

In April 2014 Salma underwent brain surgery, which involved disconnecting the right side of her brain. The procedure was expected to leave her paralyzed on the left side of her body. She would have to re-learn all basic functions including walking. The doctors said that she might regain some arm and hand movement over time, but they were not certain of what was to come.

Salma's family is happy to report, "We have been blessed by our good Lord, and Salma again has surprised doctors on all that she has been capable of doing after this surgery. A miracle in the making we have no doubt about that."

Salma is making great progress, but she has more procedures and therapy in her future so she and Sarah must remain in Dallas for many months.

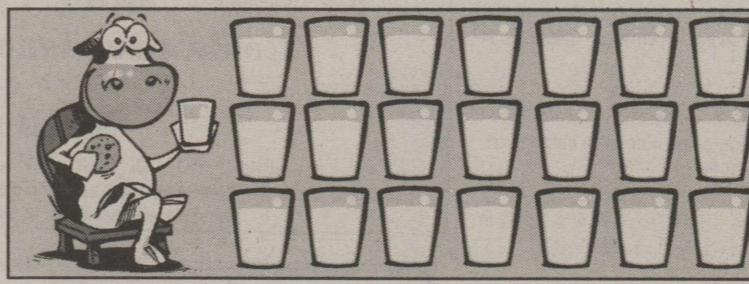


Pink Heals fire trucks roll through Stratford

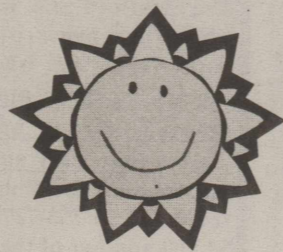

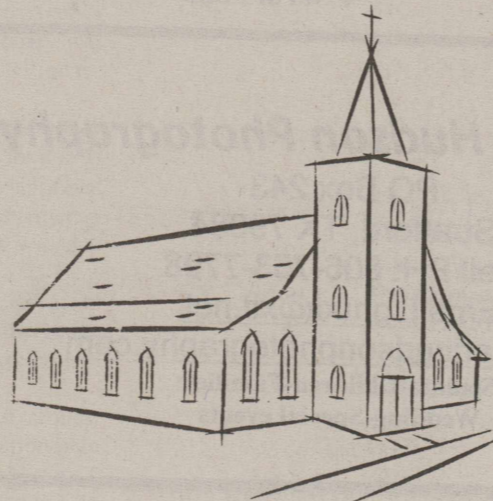

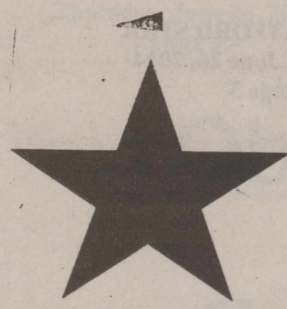
