



JAMBOREE BANNERS



Magic of Hollywood Returns to Doric Theatre

For 35 years, the single screen at the Doric Theatre in Elkhart, Kansas was dark. On June 24, 2016, the Doric theater came alive again with the Magic of Hollywood.

Purchased by Mitchell Theatres last August, the 98 year old Doric Theatre has been completely remodeled with stadium seating, high back rocker seats, 7.1 digital surround sound and extra wide row spacing. The original exterior ticket booth has been restored, complete with Red Velvet curtains.

The Doric is the first "boutique" theater for the circuit. The old projection room & balcony was converted to Oscar's Lounge, where customers can purchase a glass of wine, beer or mixed drink before the movie or take it with them in the movie to enjoy. Appetizers are also available from the kitchen that was added in the old lobby. Hard wood floors, English pub tables & chairs and a fireplace all add to a warm, inviting atmosphere with the 98 year old exposed brick and open beam ceiling.

The live theater element from the Doric's former Vaudeville days has also been preserved. A new performance stage was built. New stage lighting, sound system, dressing rooms and a green room were added to enhance future live productions.

Although the Doric will be playing recent movie releases on weekends, a new aspect has been added during the week. Art House & Independent movies will be screened each Wednesday and Thursday evening, a first for the area. Since opening last month, area residents have enjoyed "Papa Hemingway in Cuba" and "Sing Street." Coming Indie movies include "The Meddler," "Love & Friendship," "Dark Horse," "Genius" and "The Lobster."

The Doric Theatre remodel took place in conjunction with adding a ninth screen to Mitchell Theatres Sequoyah 8 in Garden City, Kansas earlier this spring.

Mitchell Theatres owns and operates 102 screens in 14 locations across Arizona, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico & Oklahoma. Mitchell Theatres is currently the 44th largest theater circuit in the nation, with its corporate headquarters located in Elkhart, Kansas.



High School Graduates: Sign Up Jobs And Grants

(NAPS)—According to the U.S. Department of Education, some 3.2 million high school students are expected to graduate this year. If any of them is a young man you care about, first, congratulations, and second, there's an important step he needs to take to qualify for many kinds of jobs and scholarships: registering with the Selective Service.

Why Register?

By law, young men must do so within 30 days of turning 18 to be eligible for Pell Grants, Federal Work-Study and Guaranteed Student PLUS Loans, federal job training and federal jobs. It's also necessary for jobs with many state and municipal governments as well as government contractors. Even summer and temporary workers with the federal government need to register. Some places even require it for a driver's license.

Immigrants who arrive after their 18th birthday must register within 30 days of their arrival if younger than 26.

Failure to register is a violation of federal law and could mean a \$250,000 fine, a prison term or both. up, go to www.sss.gov.



Young men who hope to get Pell Grants, Federal Work-Study and **Guaranteed Student PLUS Loans** must first register with the Selective Service.

How to Register

Fortunately, even before he graduates, a student can get help with that at school. Many high schools have volunteer registrars to assist students with signing up.


In addition to seeing the high school registrar, students and graduates can check block #22 on the Federal FAFSA application or go online at www.sss.gov from a smartphone or computer. Registration forms are also available at any U.S. post office.


Quick Registration

If you have a Social Security number and are able to register online, go to www.sss.gov/Registration/Register-Now/Registration-Form. If you do not have a Social Security number, are an immigrant male (documented or undocumented) age 18 through 25 or are not able to register online, you can pick up a Selective Service registration form at the post office or download the form at www.sss.gov/Portals/0/PDFs/regform_copyINT.pdf.

Print, sign, and mail the form to Selective Service System, P.O. Box 94739, Palatine, IL 60094-4739.




