

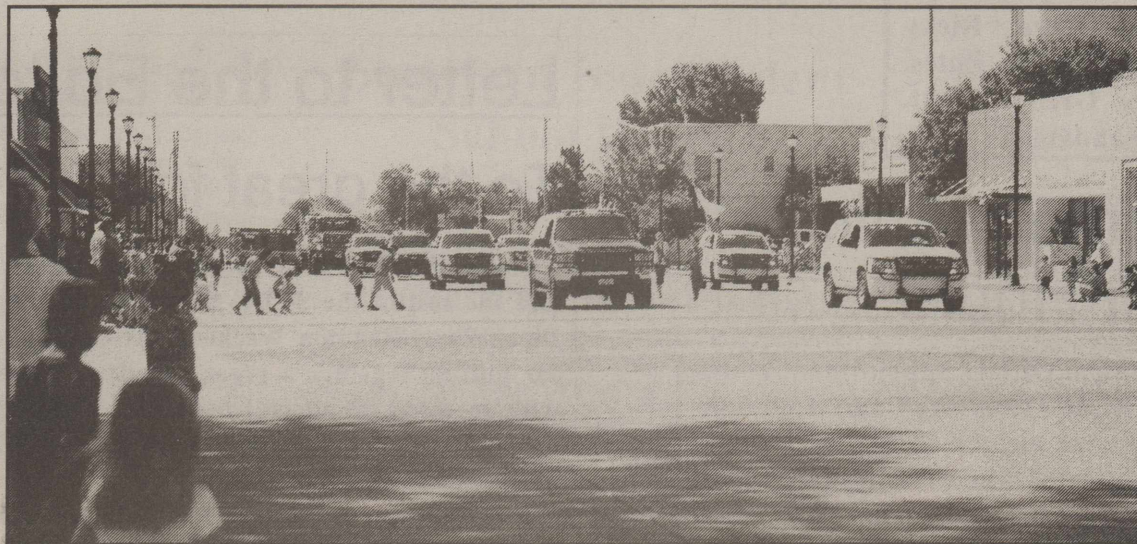

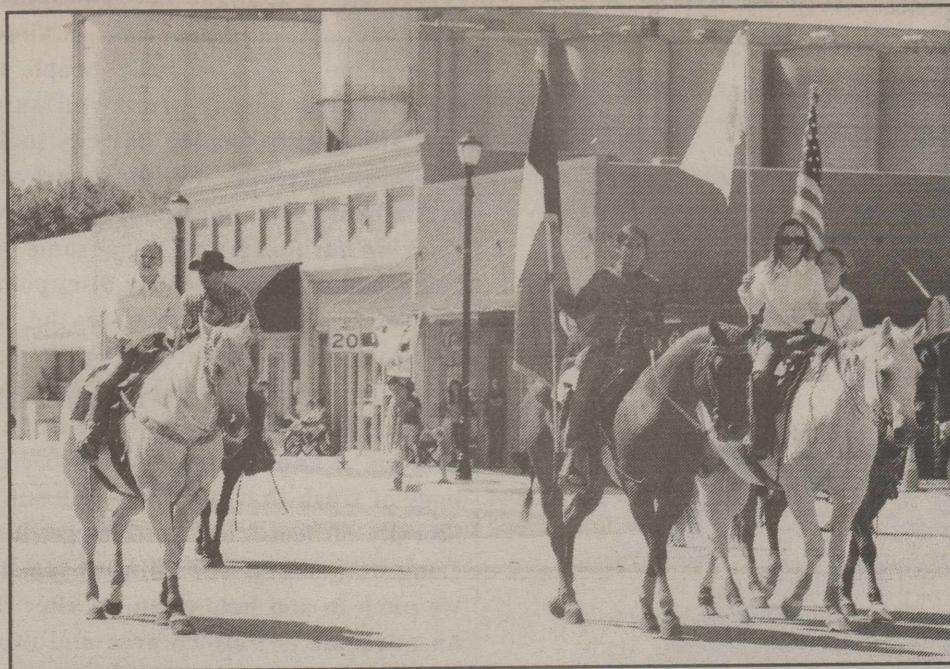

Texas cowboy wins trap shooting championship with a perfect 100 score

Perfection is difficult to achieve in sports. But **Bret Barnard** accomplished just that Thursday at the NHSFR trap-shooting competition.

The Stratford, Texas, junior scored a perfect 100 points to win the competition that featured more than 100 shooters at the Gillette Gun Club.

Barnard said he had shot 99 before Thursday, but never 100. "I was just in the zone and I was breaking them," he said about the rhythm of breaking the clay pigeons. "It's just a feeling you don't feel every day. Some days you have a good day and other days you don't. Today was a good day."

The Texas state champion trap shooter got his practice sessions in after qualifying for the NHSFR in Gillette. He estimated he practiced "probably" four times a week to win the championship belt buckle, which he'll receive at 6:40 p.m. Friday at Morningside Park.

Barnard knows only his name will go on the trophy and he gets to keep the belt buckle, but Thursday's title was a joint effort.

Barnard's father even built a shooting range for him, and the new trap-shooting champion has had tremendous support from his hometown and family.

"It's an amazing feeling that God has blessed me like this," Barnard said. "When you look at it, it's just a buckle you get to put on your belt or to put on your wall. When I walked in here I was already a winner because I follow Jesus Christ. I just knew today that if he wanted me to win it, I was going to win it. If not, I'll come back next year and try again."

Texas Panhandle Honor Flight

KVII's GM Laura Wolfe, Guyann Taylor, Ryan Hazelwood & members of News Channel 7 TV Station joined forces with the Texas Panhandle Honor Flight, hosting our first ever telethon

on May 19th 2016. The generous outpouring of the communities in the Texas Panhandle was overwhelming. Donations made in honor or memory of the area veterans came in through the end of the broadcast.

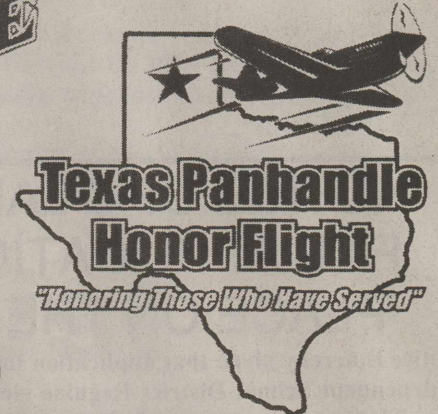
The anxiety was high during the last part of the day as we strived to reach our goal. Contributions continued to roll in after the telethon raising our final outcome just over \$67,000 paying 1/3 of the flight's expenses.

About 4 pm May 19th, the phone rang and Rachel Dorris of Wheeler, TX called to make a contribution on behalf of her son, Hazen Dorris. 5-year-old Hazen held a lemonade stand in August last summer and put his money in his piggy bank. He held onto his financial gain through the summer and all the way into December. Hazen tells his mom that "old people" are his friends.

While he was visiting a local nursing home around Christmas time, Hazen decided the residents there needed care packages. So he and his mom shopped for the residents using some of his piggy bank money, purchasing small lotions and personal items to gift the residents.

There was still money left in his piggybank when it came around to May 19th and young Hazen recalled his visits with his grandfather, Meryl Barnett. Corp. Barnett served in WWII in the 45th Infantry of the U.S. Army from 1940-1945. Meryl spent 511 days in combat, received the Bronze Star, holds 9 campaign stars which included four beach head landings. Corp. Barnett served in Sicily, Italy, France & Germany and participated in the liberation of Dachau Concentration Camp, April 29, 1945. Hazen may have recalled his grandfather telling of his military service and the trip he took in 2008 on the Texas Panhandle Honor Flight. He graciously asked his mother to help him give that organization the rest of his piggy bank money - all \$25 of it- to the Texas Panhandle Honor Flight. If you should be in Wheeler this August look for Hazen's lemonade stand as he has plans to do another one this year.

Community Comments: There were no community comments.

Richard Chumley asked for the motion to approve the last months minutes. Janet Reinart motioned to approve the minutes and Marsha Wright seconded and the motion carried 3/0.

CEO Report:

Coldwater Manor:
Mark Moore reported to the Board of Directors that currently there are 23 residents at Coldwater Manor.

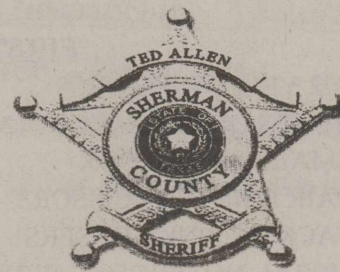
Meeting called to order:

Mark Moore presented to the Board of Directors the two contractors bids to repair the hail damage to the Stratford Hospital District properties.
A discussion was held, and the decision was made to contract ACR Commercial Roofing from Pampa, TX.

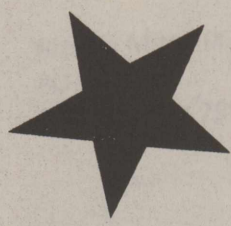

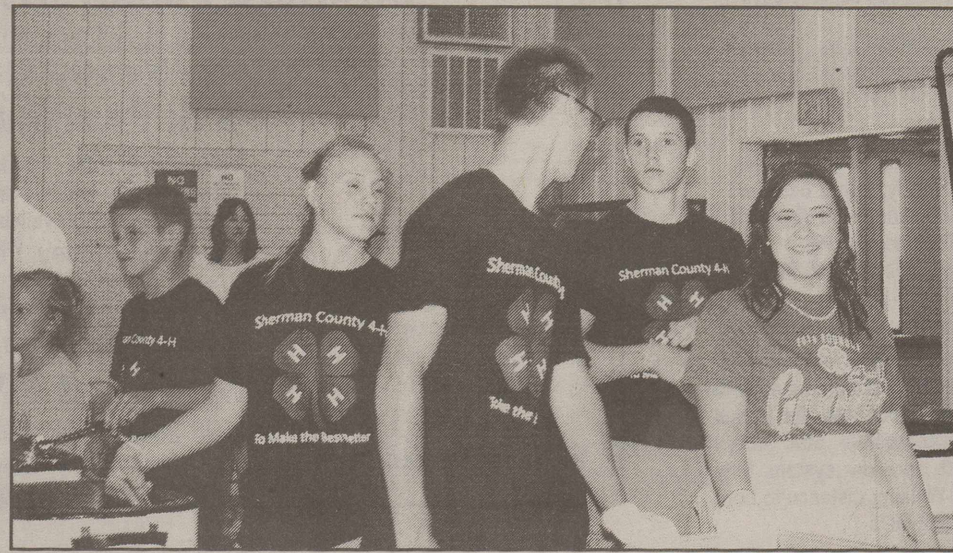

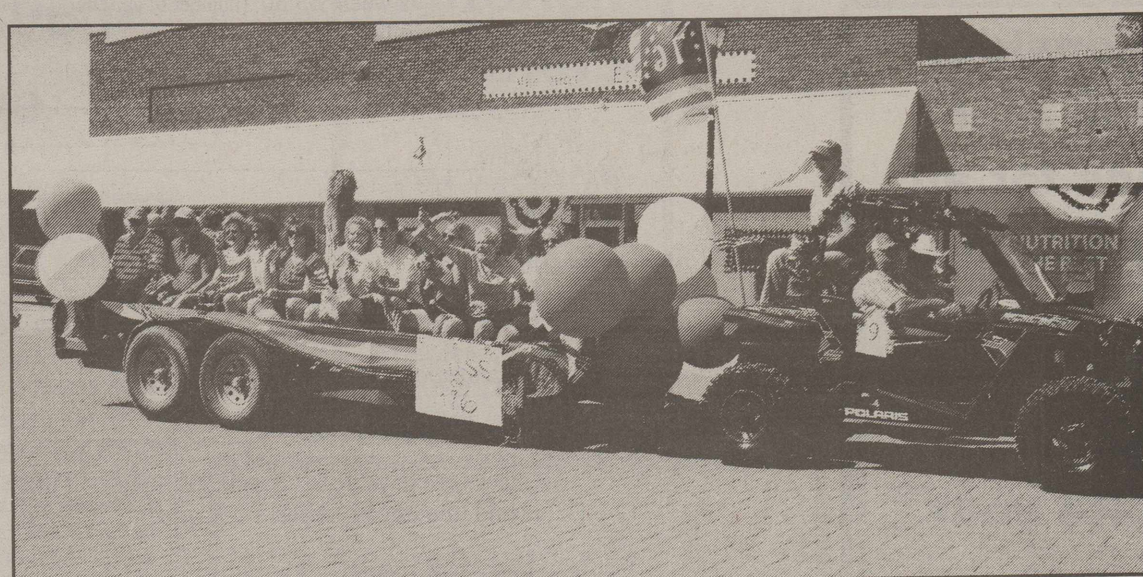
