## Pigs may one day be main

## source for needed organs

CHICAGO (AP) - Transplant
doctors predict pigs will become
a main source of donor organs for
people once the many technical
problems of oross-species
transplantation are resolved.
While primates such as chim-
panzees and baboons might be a
better match, pigs are cheaper,
more plentiful and easier to
breed, says Dr. Hugh
Auchincloss J., assistant pro-
fessor of surgery at Harvard
University.
"What could change, I suppose,
is that we could become better at
making artificial organs than we
are now. Then we wouldn't need
the animal organs. But I don't see
that as comming first,"
Auchincloss said Tuesday at the
annual meeting of the American
