Texas teenager cleared in death
CIUDAD JUAREZ, Mexico for lack of evidence, but Martin (AP)-A district judge has ruled
there was not enough evidence to there was not enough evidence to
convict a Texas teen-ager of killing a Juarez policeman a year ago and has freed the youth.
Kelly Martin, 19, of Dell Cit Kelly Martin, 19, of Dell City,
was grinning as he walked out of the CeReSo prison about noon Tuesday after more than a year
of captivity of captivity.
"You bet I'm happy! I'm 19, but I feel like I've aged to 30 ,"
Martin said. "I can't wait to be across (the border). Juarez District Judge Flor Aguilar Casas acquitted Martin tempted murder charges. Martin had been accused of fatally shooting Juarez officer Pedro
German Vera Gallegos and German Vera Gallegos and
wounding fellow officer Jose Zuniga Acevedo early on the morning of May Z, 1988. A couple of hours after he had Gail and attorney Miguel Angel Luevano visited the judge in her courtroom to thank her for the after a handshake. "The prosecution didn't have enough evidence for a convic-
