ral illness (especially in children): in such cases, the bone marrow usually recovers and the situation reverses itcertain drugs (notably, tranquilizers
nd anti-convulsants)
cause marrow malfunctions, once the drug is withdrawn, the marrow cells recover.
However, some forms of anemia do not cure themselves. In particular, leukemia and acute toxic
