Lamb, a diaber pregnancy, Mrs Lamb, a diabetic, suffered from hypertension, kidney failure and
complications that threatened her with blindness, Low said. She took the three-day bar ex-
am for her husband in July 1985 am for her husband in July 1985
while seven months pregnant. Then, she was rushed to the hospital and placed in intensive care until the birth of he daughter 10 days later, he said.
"It's astonishing to me," said Chief Justice Malcolm Lucas, "that she was able to pass the ba and get the ninth highest grade.

## EPA says plants in 45 states pollutes nation's waterways <br> WASHINGTON (AP) - The Ms. Hanmer said that while the mid-1992. <br> Environmental Protection Agen- statistics are worrisome the cy says hundreds of industrial cy says hundreds of industrial plants in 45 states must curb chemical releases into waterways because the waters nearby are becoming too contaminated with toxic substances. <br> The EPA on Tuesday released a list of nearly 600 stretches a list of nearly 600 stretches of lakes, rivers and streams that lakes, rivers and streams that the agency said do not meet state water quality standards because of chemical emissions from nearby industrial plants and othe facilities. <br> The EPA said only about 40 percent of the 897 polluters have submitted plans approved by the EPA to bring the toxic releases into compliance by 1992. The re- mainder have either submitted mainder have either submitted plans that were rejected or have plans that were rejected or have yet to submit a compliance program, officials said. <br> The EPA report covered 126 toxic chemicals including a variety of substances believed to chemicals so that the variety of sub

may be largely due to chemical
runoffs from agriculture or min ing operations in many cases the industria

The agency said toxic chemical releases from 879 industrial plants, city water treatment plants and other facilities are
causing or significantly concausing or significantly con
tributing to violations in water quality standards in 595 waterways across the country.
Ms. Hanmer said that Ms. Hanmer said that in most cases the polluting plants are do-
ing so legally because the ing so legally because the
releases are within state permit restrictions.
